TEL AVIV (WNS) -- As the exchange of fire between Syrian and Israel continued, Lebanon admitted that its artillery has been taking part in the shelling of Israeli positions on the western slopes of Mt. Hermon.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The United States government is intervening on humanitarian grounds on behalf of the persecuted Jewish community in Syria, Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, said here.

TEL AVIV (WNS) --- The National Religious Party has refused to join the Labor Align-ment-led coalition headed by Yitzhak Rabin.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Federal Department of Health, Education and Welfare has been accused of failing to respond directly to a request from the New York Metropolitan Coordinating Council to qualify Jews whose primary language is Yiddish to benefit from government programs to aid minority groups.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israeli author Moshe Shamir and other intellectuals conducted a five-day hunger strike outside the home of Premier Golda Meir to protest against any withdrawal from territory on the Golan Heights.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The AFL-CIO Executive Council has adopted a resolution demanding that the U.S. in improving relations with Arab countries do nothing "that would in any way diminish America's friendship for and support of Israel."

BEERSHEBA - A record numbe of 436 Degrees were awarded to students at Ben-Gurion University of the Negrev. Among those to receive Degrees are the University's first graduates from the Depts. of Chemistry, Geology, Mathematics, Physics and industrial and Management Engineering. The ceremony will also include the awarding of nine M.Sc. Degrees and 54 Teaching Diplomas. A total of 188 women students are to receive Degrees and Diplomas.
