KISSINGER CITES TERMS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger stressed here that "U.S. friendship for Israel has not been diminished and will not be diminished as a result of increasing friendship toward the Arab countries."

He told a press conference that "the security of Israel which we remain committed can

best be secured in the context of a peace settlement." Kissinger said there were no secret agreements in the accords signed by Israel with Syria and Egypt.

Kissinger said that the representation of Palestinians at the Geneva peace conference had not come up and the U.S. had "no contacts" with the Palestinians.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel plans to submit formal protests to the appropriate international organizations over the torture suffered by Israeli prisoners of war in Syria, a senior military spokesman announced here.

Returning POW's did not describe their experiences in detail, but apparently the worst torture methods were reserved for downed Air Force men. Capt. Ami Rokah, a Mirage pilot, said he had been blindfolded for a month and a half and interrogated endlessly. He said he and other pilots were beaten on their ears to make them physically unable to fly again.

Three Israeli Bedouin civilians the Syrians captured when they were tortured brutally, starved and constantly questioned.

The Cabinet has announced it is making a full dossier on the details of Syrian torture of Israeli POW's which will be published as soon as the briefing of returned POW's is completed.

Israel army officials, meanwhile, have categorically denied allegations by returned Syrian POW's that they were mistreated in Israeli prisons.

In another development, two Israeli pilots, captured in Lebanon when their Phantom jet was shot down near the Syrian-Lebanese border two months ago, were returned across the Rosh Hanikra border post. Two other Israeli prisoners in Lebanon had been released quietly earlier.

The four, who were the last of the Israeli military men held by Arab countries, were exchanged for 11 Lebanese civilians and one policeman captured by Israeli forces during commando raid on Southern Lebanon following the Kiryat Shemona massacre.
