Panous, 2 of Thousands

The joy that welcomed the news that Valery and Galina Panov were receiving exit visas to leave the Soviet Union has to be tempered by the thought that more than 100,000 other Soviet Jews are still waiting for an answer to their applications for emigration. As the British Jewish women who were picketing the performance of the Bolshoe Ballet in London said: "The Panovs are just two people. Thousands more are being persecuted."

(At press time, the Panovs arrived and are settled in Israel.)

The Panov case was an international cause celebre particularly enlisting the support of performing artists who were incensed over the fact that two such talented ballet dancers could not work for over two years simply because they had applied to go to Israel. But others languish in Soviet jails and labor camps for the same reason and many others have also lost their jobs for applying for exit visas.

lost their jobs for applying for exit visas. This is why President Nixon's Annapolis speech claiming that the Jackson-Mills-Vanik amendments would be harmful to detente is disturbing. Since the Soviet Union theoretically also benefits from detente the USSR should be required to make some concessions. The Soviets apparently realize this somewhat and the release of the Panovs on the eve of President Nixon's trip to Moscow may have been a gesture toward supporters of the Jackson Amendment in Congress.

But it is not enough and the President has the duty while in Moscow to make every effort to convince the Soviet leaders that they must allow Jews and others to emigrate and to stop the harrassment of those who apply for visas. The release of the Panovs should be followed by the release of all others who wish to go.
