NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee welcomed a proposed new Declaration of Faith by the Presbyterian Church in the U.S. that repudiates prejudice against Jews as "of potentially historic importance for the improvement of understanding and mutual acceptance between Jews and Christians.

The Declaration was adopted for study by the General Assembly of the 900,000 member Presbyterian denomination, which met in Louisville. The Declaration, part of a proposed Book of Confessions, will be sent to each of the Church's 61 presbyteries for study and will come up for final adoption at its 1976 Assembly. This is believed to be the first such statement adopted by any Christian body as part of its Confessional.

The Jackson Amendment



SENATOR JACKSON

Many of us are probably not fully aware of the controversy raging in Washington on granting most-favored nations status to Russia which the Administration is attempting so hard to put into law.

The Jackson Amendment would make it a condition precedent that Russia permit free immigration to any nation which will welcome them.

In a speech before a large gathering at Jerusalem Great Synagogue Dinner in New York, Sen. Jackson outlined the purpose and significance of his amendment, and the ISRAELITE agrees 100 per cent.

Here are some excerpts from Sen. Jackson's speech:

I am not impressed when the White House tries to dismiss the wholesale violations of human rights in the Soviet Union as none of America's business.

The Jackson Amendment, far from intruding into the internal affairs of the Soviet Union, simply conditions eligibility for certain U. S. economic concessions on respect for the right to emigrate, which is specifically affirmed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and in other international agreements which the Soviet Union itself has ratified.

All along, the Administration has deliberately attempted to misrepresent to the American peo-
