## ARAB SURPLUS INVESTMENT BILLIONS COULD INFLUENCE U.S. POLITICS

Revenues of the Middle East oil-producing countries may total \$100 billion in 1974 and are expected to multiply several times in the next decade. This year, cash surpluses of \$40 to \$50 billion are likely to land in international business and money markets. Part of this wealth is being invested in the U.S., and much more probably will be. Many financial experts believe our economy can absorb it without losing control of American industries to foreign interests. But if the 1973 oil embargo could force Europe and Japan to change their positions on the Middle East mushrooming Arab investment might conceivably come to exert massive influence on America's political affairs.

It is clear that the days of cheap energy are gone, probably forever, and that the new oil prices will raise the cost of virtually all products and services, both in the West and in underdeveloped countries. It is clear, too, that though a worldwide quest for new sources of energy is on, adequate substitutes are still many years away.

Far less clear is the potential economic and political impact of the ever-increasing cash

### RELATIVES OF SOVIET JEWS SEEK U.S. AID

NEW YORK (WNS) -- In an effort to help free Soviet Jewish "prisoners of conscience" relatives of three of the prisoners, themselves recent immigrants to Israel, have come to the United States to seek the aid of the American government and people.

The three: Chaim Drori, a brother-in-law of Yosif Mendelvich, who was sentenced to 12 years at the first Leningrad trial in 1970; Mrs. Eva Butman, whose husband, Hillel, was sentenced to 10

years in the second Leningrad trial in 1971, and Julia Dymshits, whose father Mark Dymshits was given 15 years in the first Leningrad trial, were brought here by the National and Greater New York Conferences for Soviet Jews.

### NAZI HUNTER JAILED: PLANS APPEAL

BONN (WNS) -- Cologne Judge Viktor Somoskoey sentenced Mrs. Beate Klarsfeld, the Nazi hunter, to two-months in jail for attempting to kidnap in 1971 Kurt Lischka, the former Gestapo Chief of Paris and bring him to France.

According to her Israeli lawyer, Arie Marinsky, Mrs. Klarsfeld has rejected the court's suggestion that she seek a clemency decree and instead is appealing her sentence.

Mrs. Klarsfeld, who holds French and German citizenship, readily admits she sought to bring Lischka, now a Cologne businessman, to France where he has been sentenced to life imprisonment in absentia for his role in the deportation of 100,000 French Jews and others during World War II.
