Oh, how Cole Porter would have loved the Minnelli show Liza which opened at the Riviers earlier in the week. When he wrote of one of those fabulous nights and trips to the moon on gossamer wings, the legendary Princetonian obviously had someone like Liza in mind. Hers was truly an etheral performance.

It would be absolute folly for any one hostelry to claim it possessed the greatest entertainer in show business. Each has its ble. box office champion gifted with exceptional ability. They date back to the Joe E. Lewis-El Rancho era and include such hallowed names as Judy Garland, Nat (King) Cole, the immortal Durante, Sophie Tucker and those adult ragamuffins once referred to as The Clan.

Yet, there is something so genuinely extra special about a Minnelli performance which sets it apart from her contemporaries -- living and gone. She has a mystique which rouses curiosity and that Godgiven ability to make news wherever she appears.
