### SADAT READY FOR PEACE, HE SAYS

LONDON (WNS) -- Egyptian Premier Anwar Sadat, interviewed on BBC Television, said "I am ready for a peace agreement with Israel." Sadat said his acceptance of Security Council Resolution 242 in-

SAN CLEMENTE, Calif. (WNS) -- President Nixon has publically denied for the first time allegations made in the news media last May that he was anti-Semitic.

The President cited his vigorous political and military backing for Israel and the appointment of Jews to high offices in his administration.

The President's denials are contained in a book by Rabbi Baruch Korff, head of the Committee for Fairness to the President. Rabbi Korff presented a copy of the book called "The Personal Nixon: Staying on the Summit" to Nixon at the Summer White House here. The book contains a lengthy interview Rabbi Korff held with Nixon plus answers to a series of questions that the rabbi sent to the President later.

The allegations against Nixon stemmed from news media reports that the President used anti-Semitic slurs and other ethnic epithets in the White House with aides which were included in taped conversations. The report was immediately denounced by J. Fred Buzhardt, counsel to the President as a "fabrication."

In the interview, Nixon said he had ordered the major airlift of weapons to Israel in the Yom Kippur War over the objections of many administration officials. He said he rejected objections from the "so-called Eastern elite" to naming Henry J. Kissinger as Secretary of State. He also cited his appointment of other Jews such as Dr. Herbert Stein as chairman of the Council of Economic Advisors, Dr. Arthur Burns as chairman of the Federal Reserve System and Walter Annenberg, Jr. as Ambassador to Britain.

Sadat also admitted that he had been an admirer of Hitler and that he and other Egyptians had supported the German cause in World War II.

There appears to be a general inclination for voters all over the country this year to stay away from the polls in droves.

Instead of being indignant at Watergate and coming out stronger than ever to support the candidates of their choice, attitudes of disgust and indifference have materialized in practically every primary election held so far. This is a sad commentary and we will do everything possible to break the trend here in Nevada.

If you have not registered, please do so. If you are registered, please vote. Here's why.

Although there are more candidates who have filed this year for more elective offices than ever before, it really is not that confusing if you analyze the selections to be determined in the individual election districts.

For instance, statewide, of the 50 candidates, none has filed against Supreme Court Justice John Mowbray, who is automatically reinstated. Three have filed against Supreme Court Justice Gordon Thompson, from which two will be selected in the primary on September 3rd, to compete in the general election November 5th.

For U. S. Senate, from which Sen. Alan Bible has announced retirement, registered Democrat and Republican voters will separately nominate their choices from three who have filed in each party. There is no primary for the sole Independent-American candidate. For U.S. Congressman, Democrats select one of four, the Republicans one of three and again, no primary for the Independent-American.

For the Governor the Democrats have six hopefuls, while four Republicans have filed and again only one Independent-American. In the Lieut. Governor contest there are two Republicans and three Democrats, the same status as we find for Secretary of State. There is no Democrat contest for State Treasurer, with one applicant, but three will vie for the Republican nomination. No primary contest for State Controller or for Republicans in the Attorney General race, where two Democrats seek the
