TEL AVIV (MDA) -- The new Tiberias First Aid Station of Magen David Adom, Israel's emergency medical health and disaster service was recently dedicated in memory of the valiant sons of Tiberias who fell in the wars of Israel.

NEW YORK -- Dr. William A. Rosenthal, 54, dean of Yeshiva University's Wurzweiler School of Social Work, died July 12.

BONN (WNS) -- Members of the Free Demo-cratic Party are pressuring one of its MP's, Ernest Achenbach to resign his key position from the Bundestag's Foreign Affairs Committee where he has been blocking ratification of Franco-German treaty which would allow Germany to prosecute Nazis convicted in French

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel is trying to close off its borders to prevent terrorist infiltration, Premier Yitzhak Rabin told the Knesset, and that at the same time the country was being organized to resist any terrorists who do get through,
