JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

BONN (WNS) -- Ernst Achehbach, who was a Nazi diplomat in Paris during World War II, has announced he is resigning from the Bundestag's Foreign Affairs Committee where he has been blocking ratification of a Franco-German treaty allowing West Germany to retry Nazis war criminals convicted in absentia in France.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Hebron Mayor Sheikh Ali Jaabari has expressed the opinion that peace is now possible if logic rather than emotions will be used as a guide for policy.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Joint Advisory Committee of the Synagogue Council of America and the National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council and the National Jewish Commission on Law and Public Affairs have asked the U.S. Supreme Court to reject an appeal from a district court ruling that the provisions in the 1958 federal Humane Slaughter Act permitting schechita (kosher slaughtering) was constitutional.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Joseph Ralbag, special emissary from the Israeli Ministries of Religious Affairs and Defense, is in the United States to obtain Torah schrolls for synagogues in Israel mainly for commemorating soldiers who died during the Yom Kippur War.


TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Separate funerals will be held for each of the 3000 Yom Kippur War dead now buried in temporary cemeteries.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The World Zionist Organization and the Knesset Education Committee will set up a joint committee to promote Jewish education in the diaspora,

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The 140 delegates to the Conference of the Europe-Israel Parliamentary Friendship Association ended a two-day conclave here by urging European governments not to give in to Arabeconomic pressures aimed against Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The Soviet Union is conducting an unparalled effort to strengthen Syria, Premier Yitzhak Rabin told a meeting of the Labor Party's moshav section.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Paul Zuckerman, general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, who has returned from the World Assembly of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem, reported that he found Israelis no longer expressing weariness but instead "a growing sense of solidarity of oneness with the Jewish people, with Jewish history and with the demands of our common Jewish destiny."


