people in a letter to Msgr. John Nolan, president of the Ponti-fical Mission to Palestine which was cefe-brating its 20th anniversary.

"The Palestinians are particularly dear to us because they are the people from the Holy Land, because some of them are followers of Christ and because they have endured and continue to endure many tragic sufferings," the Pope said. He said that for years they lived under inhuman conditions which "have provoked frustrations among many Palestinians and in some cases caused such anxiety and despair that they were driven to acts of violent protest which we deplore with sadness."

The Pope expressed the hope that a solution for the Palestinian problem would develop through the Middle East peace negotiations.

Israelite Ads Pay

Force is speeding up preparation programs in the wake of fears in Israel that a new war could break out by the end of the year.

Chief of Staff Mordechai Gur told a meeting of the Israel-American Chamber of Commerce that a new Middle East war is a real possibility by the end of the year. He stressed that Israel must prepare itself spiritually, mentally and organizationally for the eventuality of a new war. His warning followed a similar one by Defense Minister Shimon Peres over television. Gur said a new war could break out if the United Nations troops were forced out of the buffer zones and he said in that case Israel might not wait to be attacked

Peres told the Knesset that the rate of Soviet advisors and technicians coming to Syria had been speeded up. Syria is reportedly an armed camp as the Soviets have been pouring in weapons including sophisticated fighter planes, missiles and the newest tanks. Peres also told the Knesset that the Soviet Union was arming the terrorist organizations.

Former Foreign Minister Abba Eban in a speech in Tel Aviv warned against standing on a status quo based on the disengagement agreements with Egypt and Syria. He said that there will either be further improvements in Israel-Arab relations within the next six months or another war.

The warnings by officials are seen as part of an effort to convince the military and public of the seriousness of the situation and the need for all-out preparations. The army has speeded up work on its new fortifications along the Syrian and Egyptian lines and even the Jordanian (Continued on Page 3)

No War Right Away

If history repeats itself, any war in which the Russians are involved will not start when it is expected.

We know how aware the Arabs are about President Nixon being wrapped up in Water-gate, impeachment or resignation. It is an open secret that Russia is pouring arms into Syria to the overflowing stage. Israel knows that Syria's air force is stronger than Egypt's ever was. This makes Syria chomping at the Saudi Arabia, flooded with oil billions, has sent more revenue to the other Arab nations than the U.S. has provided for Israel.

This makes it ripe for the Arabs to open up again on Israel, right. Wrong.

The Russians do not allow nations they are aiding to attack when it is expected. Emotion plays no part with their strategy. They wait until the enemy is complacent, lured into a false sense of peaceful security. Then, bam, the roof falls in.

In 1949 Johnson was recalled to the newsroom in N.Y.C. The next day the Commies swarmed over the 39th parallel and the war
