

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

PARIS (WNS) -- Arab League Secretary General Mahmoud Riad has declared here that the Arab world expects the nine members of the European Common Market to put into concrete action their earlier expressions of "support for the restoration of the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people and Israel's withdrawal from the occupied territories."

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel has denied charges by Syria that Israeli forces in their withdrawals on the Golan Heights had wrecked and destroyed the town of Kuneitra and other villages.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israel's inflation "can only be stopped by national unity," Yeruham Meshel, secretary general of Histadrut said here.

DETROIT (WNS) -- Persons who say they won't vote for Sander Levin in his quest for the Democratic nomination for Governor of Michigan because he is a Jew, have been supporting his opponent Jerry Cavanagh.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The United Jewish Organizations of Williamsburg, which represents more than 100 Jewish Organizations, most of them Hasidic in the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn, has filed an appeal in a Federal Court of Appeals against a federal district court ruling upholding the constitutionality of a recent redistricting of Assembly and State districts which the UJO has charged, discriminates against Williamsburg's 45,000 Hasidic Jews.

PARIS (WNS) -- Nearly 80 graves were destroyed when a group of vandals desecrated the Jewish cemetery of Fegersheim near Strasbourg.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel has refused to release convicted terrorists in exchange for Egyptian permission to continue Israel's search for missing bodies in the Sinai.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Bank of Israel has ordered the nation's banks to cut back on the amount of credit they have been giving out as part of the move to combat inflation.

WALTHAM, MASS. -- Abner J. Kupperman of New York City and Water Mill, Long Island, a leading fund-raising executive during the past 33 years, has been named Vice President for Development and University Relations at Brandeis University.

NEW YORK -- A team of students in the social sciences and law has joined the staff of the Institute for Jewish Policy Planning and Research of the Synagogue Council of America for the summer, to investigate several issues currently confronting American Jewry.

NEW YORK -- Dr. Max Nussbaum, 64, a past president of the Zionist Organization of America, and a noted Rabbi who fled Nazi Germany, died from a heart attack.

NEW YORK -- The Zionist Organization of America called on the Agricultural Committee of the House and Senate to use America's dominant position in food production as leverage to induce the oil producing nations to lower their prices.

NEW YORK -- The American Sephardi Federation, which is the all-embracing organization for Sephardic Jews in the United States, has been accepted into membership by the American Association for Jewish Education.

NEW YORK -- Three scholars have been awarded grants of \$3,000 each for the academic year 1974-75 by the Synagogue Council of America through its Institute for Jewish Policy Planning and Research.

TEL AVIV (MDA) -- In the wake of the recent coup and fighting in Cyprus, Magen David Adom, Israel's Emergency Medical Health and Disaster Service, received an urgent request and immediately shipped fresh blood to the embattled neighboring island.

EAST ORANGE, N. J. (WNS) -- The Metropolitan Conference on Soviet Jewry has presented an official of Hurok Concerts with an appeal to Igor Moiseyev, director of the Moiseyev dance troupe, asking him to intercede for 17 Soviet Jewish artists who have been constantly refused exit visas.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Two American students were detained by Soviet security police in Kiev after attending a party given by Zolo Torevsky, a local film director.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Israeli training ship, the "Mavo'ot Yam," picked up 42 Turkish soldiers in lifeboats off the Cypriote port of Paphos and brought them to Israel.

WASHINGTON -- B'nai B'rith has added a special aliyah information section to its Israel programs to coordinate and provide educational and informational activities on resettlement opportunities in Israel.

CHICAGO -- Leaders of B'nai B'rith and its Hillel Foundations were among more than 500 mourners at the funeral rites for Myron E. Herzog, 62, a past national chairman of the B'nai B'rith Foundation.

WASHINGTON -- B'nai B'rith has asked the U.S. State Department to intercede on behalf of Syrian Jews Yusef Shaluh and Azur Zalta, being tried in secret in Damascus for the murder of four young Jewish women.

ROCHESTER, MINN. -- B'nai B'rith has appointed Rabbi Allen Bennett of Akron, Ohio, ordained this year by the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, as chaplain of the B'nai B'rith Center at the Mayo Clinic medical complex here.
