### DAVID CANTER FOR COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Las Vegas attorney David Canter, 37, of 4650 Bridlewood Court has filed as a Democratic candidate for a seat on the Clark County Commission.

Canter, vice-president of the Clark County School Board and a member of the Regional Planning Council, is seeking the Dis-trict G seat now held by James "Sailor" Ryan.
