JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

ELIZABETH, N. J. (WNS) -- Rabbi Pinchas Teitz, a former member of the presidium of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada has sent Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin a telegram recommending that the Israel government set a five-year moratorium on acceptance and recognition of converts, regardless of the halachic status of their conversion.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Meir Kahane, the founder and former leader of the Jewish Defense League, has arrived here from Israel to organize demonstrations against Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Edward Sanders, president of the Jewish Federation-Council of Greater Los Angeles, will receive the first Aleph Tav award of the American Friends of Tel Aviv University (AFTAU) at the Inaugural Aleph Tav Dinner at the Beverly Hilton here September 14.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israeli Defense Minister Shimon Peres will be the principal speaker at the 1974 Fall International Leadership Conference in Montreal September 6-8 which will inaugurate a campaign to provide immediate and large-scale economic aid to Israel through the Israel Bond program.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The State Department has disagreed with Israel's contention that Syria has violated the disengagement agreement by moving mortars and heavy artillery into the buffer zone between the two countries. The Department said it is "satisfied" the agreement is "working well."

LONDON (WNS) -- Friends and relatives of Dr. Heinrich Spetter, the Bulgarian Jewish economist sentenced to death in Sofia for alleged espionage, have appealed to world public opinion to intervene in what they called a new "Dreyfus Case,"

PARIS (WNS) -- France has decided to offer Egypt a loan of 200 million francs (over \$40 million) and additional credit of 300 million francs (over 60 million) a low interest over a three-year period as part of the French-Egyptian cooperation accord signed by the two countries recently. UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The 24 Jewish writers and communal leaders who were killed by orders of Stalin 22 years ago were memorialized in ceremonies here and in Washington.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Former Premier Golda Meir has revealed that the President, Premier and Foreign Minister of a "certain country" has told her they could arrange a meeting for her with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, which never materialized.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel's UN Ambassador Yosef Tekoah has characterized as "a sheer fabrication" a charge by Syria that Israel Air Force jets had penetrated Syrian air space at the time of a crash of a UN plane over Syrian territory in which nine Canadian members of the United Nations Emergency Force were killed.

TEL. AVIV (WNS) -- The naval operations headquarters of Arab terrorist groups located near the Rashidiyeh Palestine refugee camp near the Lebanese port of Tyre was shelled by Israeli navy units.

NEW YORK -- Jewish civil rights will be one of the central themes discussed at the upcoming 76th Anniversary Biennial Convention of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congrogations of America.

WALTHAM, MASS, -- Manuel J. Rivera, one of the most outstanding athlete-scholars ever to attend Brandeis University, has been named winner of a \$1000 National Collegiate Athletic Association scholarship award.
