

CATHY POST FIELD FOR JUSTICE OF PEACE

Cathy Post Field, Candidate for Las Vegas Justice-of-the-Peace, calls for giving back the Justice Court to "justice and truth" and doing with considerably less misinterpretation of the law and lawyers.

"The original concept of the Justice Court was that the person sitting on the bench was not supposed to be a lawyer," Mrs. Field pointed out at a recent AWRP meeting. "It was supposed to be a man or woman with a good sense of equitable justice and impartiality. In many states -- I might add that statistics prove that they are the states with the smaller crime rate and with the most rapid handling of cases because the J.P.'s often sit for as long as 60 hours a week in court -- there are no lawyers at all on the Justice (or lower court) bench. Since I am an unencumbered widow, I would be quite able to devote whatever time is necessary to this job.

"The recent Watergate scandal spelled practically a Waterloo for the legal profession," said Mrs. Field. "Only four of the twelve Presidents in the 20th Century have been lawyers and in

forty years Richard Nixon was the only one who took every opportunity to emphasize what a sound legal thinker he was.

"One of the greatest Presidents of our time, Harry S. Truman, sat in the role of county judge in Jackson County, Mo., a position not unlike that of a J.P. Yet, President Truman had exactly the same amount of legal background I have -- three years Pre-Law, acquired by studying nights at the same time he was holding down a full-time job to support his family. Inspired by him (I had the great privilege when I was a newspaper-woman in New York City of meeting him), I did the same thing.

"Harry S. Truman went on to make some of the most momentous decisions this country ever had to face. He was a strong leader who took full responsibility for his actions. He was a man of the people, for the people. He surrounded himself with people of trust and wisdom. Few of them were lawyers.

"During the Watergate fracas at least 370 violations of the law and Constitution by President Nixon's administration and advisers (95 percent of whom were lawyers), have so far been listed by Sen. Lowell P. Weicker, Jr., R. Conn. There may be more yet to come.

"I am not inferring that we should suspect all associated with the legal profession. The majority, I trust, are honest. What I am pointing out is that it is clear that being a lawyer is no assurance that one sitting on the Justice-of-the-Peace bench is in a better position to interpret the law and the Nevada Revised Statutes. In fact, as a

candidate, I strongly feel that not being a lawyer will help me in my judgment because I will not be influenced by attorneys appearing before me whose paths have crossed mine in the course of legal practice.

"It is the solemn responsibility of anyone asking for the public's trust to at all times exercise a judicious use of power. I offer no platforms of great change in the JP system or any miracles for cleaning up the mess that currently exists in that court.

"I say only that if you honor me by electing me I will give you all I have in compassion, understanding, and strength to find guilty those who deserve it, irrespective of their social position, race or creed. I am a concerned citizen, not a lawyer. My only promise is justice."
