BERNIE STANTON FOR COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Bernie Stanton, Republican, has filed for County Commission, District G.

Stanton will work for stronger law enforcement, improved street and traffic control, mass transportation system and consolidation of services. His commissioner's salary will be used to publish a newletter.

Stanton was born in Utah and attended Utah State University. He ran the Las Vegas and Reno agencies for Banker's Life. He was president of Gen. Agents and Manager's Assn. and L. V. Life Underwriters.

He served as President of Las Vegas Jaycees and director of

U. S. Jaycees. Stanton from 1972 to 1974 served as chairman of Clark County Republicans and presently heads the Las Vegas Strip Kiwanis Club.

Judge Kaufman's campaign chairman, Mike Dooley, announced that Kaufman Campaign Headquarters is located at 500 South Fourth Street, Las Vegas.

He attributed this to the United States policy in the Middle East which has succeeded in improving relations with the Arab countries while maintaining close relations with Israel. But Rabin cautioned against expecting any immediate changes in European policy.

In London Rabin told a press conference that Israel did not want any Lebanese territory but would protect its northern border and settlers from terrorism.

He told a meeting of Anglo-Jewish leaders that Israelis living along the northern border will never abandon their settlements despite terrorist attacks.

EUROPEANS TURN POSITIVE TO ISREAL

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin, returning here from London where he attended a meeting of the Socialist International, said he observed a positive change in the European attitude toward Israel.

NEW YORK -- In a communication to the President, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, national congregational body representing 715 Reform synagogues and 1.1 million members in the United States and Canada, lauded Mr. Ford for his "courageous" statement on amnesty before the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Chicago.

GILL BLONSLY FOR ASSESSOR

Gill Blonsley, Democrat for County Assessor, said, "I want to see a tax exemption on home improvements so that we encourage people to keep their homes in good condition, not discourage them. As our neighborhoods grow older, this is one way we can prevent their deterioration and keep property values stable."

Blonsley, formerly an assistant to retiring County Assessor James Bilbray, Sr., proposes that the first \$2,000-\$3,000 of home improvement each year be exempted from taxation. "This is one way we can fight urban blight and encourage pride of ownership without punishing the

home owner," Blonsley stated. The 36-yr.-old Democrat indicated that, as County Assessor, he would actively seek legislative changes and ad-

justments in State Tax Commission Regulations that would aid home owners faced with soaring household expenses.

"I have gone into the neighborhoods," Blonsley stated, "to hear the views of the taxpayers and give people an opportunity to question me on my proposals. There is no doubt in my mind that the home owner carries the major portion of the tax burden in our community," he added. In 1968 Blonsley was hired away from the Assessor's office by the District Board of Health where he has served as Administrative Chief of the Health Department.

SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL LEVELS IN EUROPE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A Foreign Ministry survey of 50 polls conducted in a dozen western countries shows that public support for Israel is leveling to its pre-October 1973 height following an upsurge during and immediately after the Yom Kippur War.

The survey was made by Prof. Percy H. Tannenbaum, professor of public policy and psychology at the University of California at Berkeley, who is a visiting professor at the Hebrew University's Institute of Communications.

His survey shows a "hard core" of pro-Israel support averaging around one third of the population, except in Spain, France and Italy, where it is lower, and a pro-Arab core of between five and ten percent.
