JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The announcement by France that is is ending the seven-year embargo on the delivery of arms and planes to the Middle East is being studied carefully in Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin has appealed to Israelis for unity in solving Israel's pressing social and economic problems.

JOHANNESBURG (WNS) -- Mrs. Charlotte Jacobson, chairman of the World Zionist Organization-American Section, has urged that diaspora Zionists must avoid splitting up into parties to prevent non-Zionists from taking over "work for Israel and reducing it to fund raising alone."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- In the wake of increased acts and attempted acts of terrorism the Israeli public has been warned to increase its alertness. Most of the latest attempts at sabotage have been foiled.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Charles A. Lindbergh, the aviation pioneer who died recently at the age of 72, is remembered by Jews as a sympathizer of the Naxi regime in the 1930s; as a man who refused to return a medal from Hermann Goering even after the U. S. went to war with Germany and as an advocate of American nonintervention in World War II who publicly accused American Jews of pushing the nation into war.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Ford has backed away from his 1972 proposal that the U.S. embassy in Israel be moved from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Meir Kahane, the former leader of the Jewish Defense League, launched his campaign against the policies of Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger with a street corner rally in New Yorks's garment center.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jewish Agency's Plenary Executive is scheduled to discuss a deficit of some \$200 million in this year's \$700 million Agency budget.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has complained to the United Nations Emergency Force (UNEF) about Soviet mineswaepers in Israel-controlled waters in the Gulf of Suez.

LONDON (WNS) -- Dr. Joseph Lovinger, president of the Central Board of Jewish Communities in Greece, has denied that the Greek government is supporting the recent anti-Semitic statements appearing in some Greek newspapers.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The White House has cancelled preliminary meetings Sept. 17 and 18 of the summit conference to combat inflation because those date fall of Rosh Hashana. The summit itself was moved up to Sept. 27, because, the White House noted, Yom Kippur is observed the day before.

ELIZABETH, N. J. (WNS) -- Rabbi Pinhas Teitz, a former member of the Presidium of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, has asked the Soviet government to allow him to exnume the remaining six graves in the ancient Jewish cemetery of Radin, near Vilna, which is being levelled along with six non-Jewish cemeteries.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A recent Harris Poll showed that an overwhelming majority of Americans are opposed to the United States providing either Egypt or Israel with nuclear reactors.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- An Amsterdam woman who travelled to the Middle East to get a better understanding of the Palestinians returned with a desire to alert public opinion on the deplorable situation of Jews in Syria, according in "Hervormd Nederland," the Dutch Reformed Church weekly.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger's popularity has dropped 15.5 percent in Israel since June, according to a poll taken by the Public Opinion Research Institute.
