2. Continue to give high priority to the policy of equal employment opportunities;
3. Provide for retraining of those who lose their jobs. Design now the necessary retraining plans, to be put into effect on an as-and-when-needed basis;
4. Develop a national health care system, providing continuity of service that is accessible and comprehensive;
5. Continue to pursue the national commitment to move American families out of poverty and near-poverty. This must include effective income maintenance programs;
6. Provide a strong infusion of funds into housing for the poor and middle class. Make certain that housing is built where jobs are located.

ISREAL FACES SEVERE TEST AT U.N.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel will face its most difficult and severe test at the current session of the United Nations General Assembly, Foreign Minister Yigal Allon said before leaving for New York to head Israel's delegation to the UN.

He said that with the present composition of the UN there is no chance of preventing a discussion of the Palestine Question but that Israel will still try to

convince other delegations against holding the discussion. Noting that the Palestine Liberation Organization will be represented, Allon said the PLO does not want to discuss the rights and problems of the Palestinians but to torpedo efforts for a peaceful settlement in the Middle East. "If the PLO succeeds in bringing about the adoption of anti-Israel resolutions, this can totally undermine the efforts being made now for a political settlement," Allon said.

He declared that Israel wants to solve the Palestinian problem

but this concerns a genuine Palestinian identity, not the PLO. PLO leader Yasir Arafat is expected to attend the General Assembly session.

Allon also expressed concern that Jordan might carry out its threat to boycott the Geneva peace conference on the Middle East if the Arab summit meeting in Rabat recognizes the PLO as the sole representative of Palestinian Arabs.

Jordan made the threat after a joint declaration in Cairo by Egypt, Syria and the PLO in which the PLO was said to be the "sole legitimate representative of the

Palestinians." The declaration also called for setting up a Palestinian state in any territory liberated from Israel.

Jordanian King Hussein has refused to attend a conference with Egypt, Svria and the PLO and froze all of his government's activities in connection with the Geneva conference.

GROMYKO: ISREAL HAS RIGHT TO EXIST

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Soviet Union "stands in favor of Israel existing and developing as an independent sovereign state," Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko declared in an address to the 29th session of the General Assembly.

He indicated that the USSR would resume diplomatic relations with Israel if "real, not illusory progress" is made toward a Middle East settlement. Gromyko claimed that the Soviet position in the Mideast cannot be considered one-sided

since it supports "the legitimate demands of the Arabs" and "reflects intolerance of aggression in general."

He urged the prompt resumption of the Geneva peace conference which he described as "the most appropriate forum for considering the Middle East problems." He said the time has come for deeds rather than words "to assure the legitimate rights of the Arab people in Palestine" who "must take their rightful place at the (Geneva) conference."
