

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

PARIS (WNS) -- The Executive Council of UNESCO by a 25-2 vote with seven abstentions has invited the Palestine Liberation Organization to send a delegation as observers to the UNESCO general conference here.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- For the third consecutive year there was a "Succah in the Sky" on top of the 50-story Grace Building in Midtown Manhattan.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, and Jacob Stein, who was Conference chairman during the Yom Kippur War, have defended Israeli Ambassador Simcha Dinitz against charges in the Israeli press that he allowed Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger to manipulate him during the car to the detriment of Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The new \$750,000 home of the Workmen's Circle and the Jewish Daily Forward at 45 East 33rd Street was dedicated at a five-hour ceremony attended by more than 1000 persons.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Polish Communist Party leader Edward Giereck said here that Poland is willing to resume diplomatic relations with Israel if the Jewish State is willing to make concessions on the occupied territories within a year.

GENEVA (WNS) -- After several weeks of crisis the International Credit Bank of Geneva whose chairman is Jewish financier Tibor Rosenbaum, has closed and its board of directors has asked a Geneva court to decree a payments moratorium.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Denouncing Israel as a "facist, racist, colonial regime" supported by colonialist forces of which the United States is in the forefront, Iraqi Foreign Minister Shadel Jassim Taqa told the General Assembly that the UN should reconsider its position concerning the membership of Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Tens of thousands of Jews and non-Jews demonstrated in support of Soviet Jewry in rallies in nearly 50 cities across the country.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- "The story of Shazar's life was an unbelievable mixture of all that was good and beautiful in Jewish life in the last 100 years," Premier Yitzhak Rabin told a special Cabinet meeting in memory of Schneur Zalman Shazar, Israel's third President, who died a day before his 85th birthday.

LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and three key Senators have apparently healed a rift in their discussions on the Soviet emigration issue by resolving to reformulate the agreed exchange of letters between President Ford and Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D. Wash.), according to Capitol Hill sources.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Kissinger told the delegation of 15 American Jewish communal leaders that the U.S. position, not yet determined, on the issue of recognition by the United Nations of the Palestine Liberation Organization will have the approval of the American Jewish community, according to Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations.

NEW YORK -- Three Catholic and three Jewish leaders have announced at American Jewish Committee that they will lead several hundred Catholics and Jews to Israel and Rome next year in a series of three interreligious study missions to "probe the Jewish roots of the Catholic Holy Year."
