

JAMES SANTINI FOR CONGRESS

Democratic Congressional candidate Jim Santini urged Rep. David Towell to take advantage of "a golden opportunity to help Nevada's gaming industry by supporting a key amendment to a bill pending in the House."

In a telegram to Towell, Santini pointed out that the House Judiciary Committee currently has pending before it a bill to give states which operate lotteries special benefits. However, as presently written that measure would not give the same benefits to Nevada's legalized gaming industry.

Santini told the freshman Republican Congressman the bill "offers you a golden opportunity to help our state's tourist economy by introducing an amendment to insure equal treatment for Nevada."

The bill, H.R. 6668, is designed to permit the transportation, mailing and broadcasting of advertising information, and materials concerning legalized state lotteries.

Under the amendment suggested by Santini, Nevada casinos would be given the same privileges, thus allowing them to significantly increase their national advertising and promotional efforts.

The interstate mailing of gaming guides, brochures, and other materials is illegal under present federal laws if any reference was made to gaming. Similar problems also exist in radio and television advertising regulated by the Federal Communications Commission.

"To me, this should be a bi-partisan effort to help our state," Santini told Towell. "I am making this suggestion in a spirit of cooperation and offer to assist you in any way I can."

"I feel that casino type gaming which is operated in a state which legalizes, taxes and controls that gaming should benefit from federal laws extended to other state supported gaming efforts," said Santini.

JEAN DUTTON FOR COUNTY ASSESSOR

North Las Vegas Municipal Judge Ray Daines has endorsed the candidacy of fellow Democrat Jean Dutton for the office of County Assessor.

Daines, who was a runner-up to Dutton in the September 3 primary, at the same time called for his supporters to also cast their ballots in the Nov. 5 general election for "the entire roster of Democrats" seeking office this year.

Daines described the coming election as "One of the most important Nevada -- indeed the nation -- has been confronted with in history."

"I think it is therefore doubly important," Judge Daines said, "that we gauge

the quality of the men and women who will lead us. In this spirit, as a former candidate for the vital office of Clark County Assessor, I am urging my supporters in the past primary election to support with vigor the Democratic nominee for that office -- Jean Dutton."

Judge Daines added he has "every confidence that Jean's performance in the Assessor's office will fully merit the vote of confidence given him in the primary election."

Daines' endorsement of Dutton and the Democratic ticket came in an open letter addressed to "all voters of Clark County" signed by the popular magistrate.

Prestigious Names

Moses and Karo are two prestigious Jewish names.

Rabbi Joseph Karo (1488-1751) codified Talmudical rules and rulings in his book, "Shulchan Aruch" (The Set Table), the foundation stone of what Orthodox Judaism believes the Biblical Moses requires of us.

Now another Moses and Caro (a variant of Karo) are dramatically linked.

Robert Moses, now 85, changed the face of America. As commissioner of parks and parkways in New York, he pioneered in creating the highways which created Suburbia.

What he did in New York was emulated throughout the country.

Unlike the original Moses, Robert Moses did not enjoy being Jewish. Like Goldwater, Jaworski, Schlesinger and Ehrlichmann, he discarded his Jewishness, raising his children Episcopalian.

The career of Robert Moses is the subject of a gripping biography by Robert Caro, who spent seven years searching and chronicling the career of the great builder.

Caro gave us a mixed verdict on Moses. Like the Biblical namesake, Robert Moses acquired vast powers. Unlike him, he was ruthless in exercising them, brushing aside anyone who tried to cross him.

Brilliant and exceedingly efficient, Moses did indeed alter the physiognomy of our land. But Caro contends that the roads Moses built and inspired are now bottlenecks, nullifying their original advantages. What we need now, says Caro, are trains and buses, not automobile roads which strangle the travelers.

Robert Moses scorns this verdict. He wrote a salty assault on Caro which you can get by writing Moses at his address, Randall's Island, New York.

Caro says he is a direct descendant of the Codifier, Joseph Karo. It would seem that he still adheres to his faith.

It's odd to see this new Moses-Caro connections!
