

**LEADERS STRESS COMMITMENT TO ISRAEL**

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Four American and Canadian Jewish community leaders stressed the commitment by North American Jews to meet Israel's human and social needs during a dinner attended by 750 Jewish community leaders here.

The dinner was jointly sponsored by the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds and the United Jewish Appeal. Raymond Epstein, CJF, president, said that at its four-day quarterly board meeting, the CJF primarily discussed the "needs and potentials of the 1974-75 campaigns." He said the community leaders had "pledged themselves to make it the most successful in the history of fund-raising in the United States and

Thomas O. Hecht, president of the United Israel Appeal, said that it is "not only arms, not only disengagement, but peace to which we all aspire."
