

DON HANCOCK FOR STATE SENATE

The Establishment in Washington has once more shown its total disregard for what we the people want, says Don Hancock, Independent American Party candidate for Senate, District 3. He reports that there is a bill on President Ford's desk, waiting to be signed, which will hand over \$20,000,000 of our money to presidential nominees of "both major parties" at election time, plus another \$2,000,000 to both of them for the party conventions.

Stanley W. Paher, candidate for Secretary of State invited his incumbent opponent to join him in a total campaign disclosure prior to the November 5 general election.

He also challenged all statewide candidates to disclose not only their personal financial data, but also the sources and amounts of all campaign contributions before voters go to the polls.

"On the day my opponent reveals his personal financial data and the sources and amounts of every donation made in his Primary and General Election campaigns this year," Paher said, "I shall release an identical disclosure. And, if elected to serve Nevadans as Secretary of State," he added, "I shall work to make it mandatory that a preliminary filing be made exactly one week before each election, with a final accounting issued within 15 days after both the Primary and General elections."

A native of Nevada, Paher said that he's heard rumors of individual donations of \$6,000 and more to certain candidates. "This raises the question as to why any individual would contribute several thousand dollars to candidates running for offices that pay only \$6,000 to \$25,000 annually," he said.

The youthful campaigner added that he preferred small donations from many supporters.

A member of a pioneer Nevada family, and an authority on the State's history and growth, Paher has won awards for his books, Nevada Ghost Towns and Mining Camps and Las Vegas: As It Began And How It Grew. Both volumes are being used in Nevada schools and libraries.

If elected in November, Paher will be the first Secretary of State chosen by popular vote in four years. The incumbent was appointed by the Governor, last year, to fill an unexpired term.
