## Watch Emigration Agreement

The agreement reached between the Ford Administration and members of Congress led by Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D. Wash.) which is expected to lead to large scale emigration of Jews from the Soviet Union is indded "an historic understanding in the area of human rights" as Jackson called it -- if it is realized in fact. Senators Jacob K. Javitz (R. NY) and Abraham D. Ribbicoff (D. Conn.) took a lead in fashioning this agreement.

At the same time there have been some disquieting elements since Jackson first announced the agreement from the White House. First President Ford has stressed that no specific number of emigrants has been included in the Soviet assurance to the Administration that Jews and others will be allowed to emigrate without harrassment. Even more important is the continued reports of arrests and

is the continued reports of arrests and harassments in major Soviet cities of Jews who are seeking to emigrate.

This is why the provision that Congress can veto renewal of trade benefits and credits to the Soviet Union if the agreement is not fulfilled, is so important. Jackson has stressed that Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger has assured him that the Soviet authorities will end harassment and intimidation of those who seek to emigrate. He said this means that 60,000 emigrants a year is only a "benchmark" by which Congress can judge Soviet compliance and that the actual figure will be higher

Of course the Soviets have not announced acceptance of the agreement and all we have is Kissinger's assurances of what they told him. But the reported agreement demonstrates the view held by many that detente is not a one-way street and that if the Soviets want detente they must make concessions too.
