

JIM BRENNAN FOR DIST. JUDGE

James (Jim) Brennan, candidate for District Court Judge, Department No. 2, is a former graduate of Las Vegas High School in 1948; University of Nevada Reno, 1955; and University of California Hastings College of the Law in San Francisco, 1958. While at Hastings Law School, Brennan was the recipient of the William Sanford Scholarship and wrote for the Hastings Law Journal.

Brennan was admitted to practice law in all Nevada State and Federal Courts after passing the Bar in 1958.

Since 1959, Brennan has served as Deputy District Attorney, Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital Trustee, and Justice of the Peace.

In 1968, Brennan defeated Las Vegas Sun columnist Paul Price in Price's political debut into politics, for Clark County Commissioner. In 1972, Brennan was defeated by a margin of 100 votes by R. J. Dick Ronzone for reelection to that Board.

Brennan also served as legal advisor to Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital and to the Clark County Health District.

Jim resides at 912 Ironwood with his wife, Lynda, and three children. His mother, a widow, also resides in Las Vegas and is retired after 25 years service with the telephone company.

Brennan was born in Miami, Florida in 1930 and before coming to Las Vegas in 1945 lived in Ohio, New York, New Jersey and Illinois.

In his varied job experience before be-

coming an attorney, Jim worked as a lifeguard, the Union Pacific Railroad, a mucker at Blue Diamond mine, a bus-boy in Las Vegas, a janitor in Reno while attending University of Nevada, and an Assistant Librarian while attending law school.

As a former Deputy District Attorney, Justice of the Peace, and private practitioner, Brennan has prosecuted, defended and presided over every kind of legal case from small claims to capital murder offenses.

Since Jim Brennan was a Justice of the Peace, he says he loved the trial bench work and that nothing would make his life more happy than being a trial court judge.

Brennan said that as Justice of the Peace he only recalls two reversals in all of the thousands of felony and misdemeanor matters he presided over, and on no occasion did he ever have a complaint from law enforcement, the District Attorney's Office or the defense lawyers, that they felt he had made an unfair decision.
