JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Full confidence in Ambassador Simcha Dinitz, Israel's envoy to Washington, was expressed to the Cabinet by Foreign Minister Yigal Allon.

PARIS (WNS) -- A representative of the Palestine Liberation Organization addressed the General Assembly of UNESCO immediately after the terrorist organization was granted observer status by UNESCO in an 86-2 vote. The United States and Israel voted against the resolution while France and 21 other countries abstained.

PARIS (WNS) -- Nazi-hunter Beate Klarsfeld was arrested outside the Morocco Ministry of Information in Rabat for distributing pamphlets demanding that the Arab countries "let Israel live in peace."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Lt. Gen. Mordechai Gur, Israel's Chief of Staff has declared that the Israel Defense Force is ready to meet every eventuality and if war comes the IDF will awiftly move the fighting into enemy territory.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The World Council of (Conservative) Synagogues ended its convention here with a resolution demanding that the Law of Return and other laws dealing with the Who is a Jew issue not be changed because any change would cause division and separation in Jewish communities.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Rabbi Abraham Hershberg, president of the Union of Rabbis for Latin America, said during a six week visit of Israel, the West Bank, Jordan, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Iran and Turkey, he told Moslem religious leaders that the holy war declared by the Arab world against Israel is wrong and should be declared instead against the Soviet Union.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Retired Gen. Ezer Weizman, former commander of the Israeli Air Force, has asked Defense Minister Shimon Peres, to allow him to return to active duty, a post as a commander of a jet squadron or wing or helicopter squadron.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A new teacher's guide intended to correct deficiencies and sterotypes in the treatment of Jews in American History textbooks has been published by B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- President Ephraim Katzir's car was involved in a three-car accident in which a soldier was killed and seven persons injured, including Mrs. Katzir.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jose Gelbard, a 56year old Polish-born Jewish immigrant to Argentina, has resigned as Economics Minister, according to reports reaching here from Buenos Aires.

BONN (WNS) -- Former gestapo commandant Ludwug Hahn, the "Hangman of Warsaw" has gone on trial in Hamburg charged with organizing the deportation of 330,000 Jews from Warsaw to Treblinka in 1942 and 1943.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Pinhas Sapir, chairman of the Jewish Agency and World Zionist Organization Executives, married Mrs. Rivka El-Nathan a Jerusalem widow and secretary of the Jerusalem branch of the Pioneer Women Organization.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli forces killed three Arab terrorists who infiltrated from Lebanon in a clash near Kibbutz Iftah in Upper Gaillee. Meanwhile there is a massive manhunt going on in northern Israel for another group of terrorists.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Jean Sauvagnargues, the first French Foreign Minister to visit Israel, arrived here to a cool but correct reception.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Katyusha rockets smashed into the outskirts of Kiryat Shemona, one of them hitting the home of 75-year-old Ezer Abu.

PHILADELPHIA -- Judge Paul Ribner, National Commander of the Jewish War veterans, U.S.A., urged the Ford administration and congressional leaders to move cautiously in implementing the "favorable trade agreement" with the Soviet Union.

LOS ANGELES -- American bankers, stock brokerage companies, and even the United States government have given "willing aid" to Arabs whose enormous oil wealth has enabled them to mount a dangerous drive for power, according to the current issue of Present Tense; The Magazine of World Jewish Affairs.

NEW YORK -- More than 200 American Jewish leaders, gathered in Israel for the United Jewish Appeal's 1975 Study Conference, unanimously resolved that the 1975 UJA campaign will raise the sum of \$750 million for humanitarian programs and services for the people of Israel.

nor a functional partition. What they propose is that all Jews who came to the country before 1917 can stay and all those who came after 1917 must leave."

Foreign Minister Yigal Allon met with U.S. Ambassador Kenneth Keating for what was said to be an initial assessment of the situation. Meanwhile in Washington, the U.S. government seemed to be hinting that it would accept the PLO as a participant in future negotiations on the Mideast. President Ford said the Administration has not yet made a firm decision on the PLO status.

In New York, Mrs. Faye Schenk, newlyelected chairman of the Amerizan Zionist Federation, said the Rabat decision "constitutes a setback for Secretary Kissinger's efforts, a setback for those moderate Arab forces who are not bent on Israel's destruction, and most ominously a major setback for peace in the Middle East."

Dr. Joseph P. Sternstein, president of the Zionist Organization of America, said the development in Rabat "Unmistakably signals a rejection by the Arabs of any intention of working seriously toward a negotiated settlement."

In Bangladesh where he was visiting, Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger said he did not believe the Arab summit meeting had foreclosed further Arab-Israeli peace talks. He said he would meet with Arab leaders to determine how best to proceed.

Meanwhile reports from Beirut said that four extremist terrorist groups -- the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, headed by George Habash; the Iraqi-backed Arab Liberation front; the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine-General Command, and the Popular Struggle Front -- have rejected the decision recognizing the PLO. These groups reject any negotiations with Israel and say they will agree only to a secular Palestine state embracing the pre-1948 borders.

NEW YORK -- Commenting today on the invitation by the U.N. General Assembly to the so-called "Palestine Liberation Organization," Harold M. Jacobs, President of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, denounced the PLO as "a malignant cancer, cynically maintained by the Arab oil cartel and the communists to perpetuate the misery of hundreds of thousands of Arab refugees and to murder innocent civilians,"
