that his government will never deal with the PLO. He said that if the Arab leaders decide that Jordan cannot be a party to the Geneva peace conference "then there is no one to speak to about peace on our eastern border."

Meanwhile Mapam, Rabin's Labor Party's partner in the Labor Alignment, called on the government to negotiate with any Palestinian body that would agree to recognize Israel's existence and cease all terrorist activity against Israel. But the party center rejected a proposal supporting negotiations with the PLO.

RABIN'S NEW GOVT. APPROVED BY KNESSET

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin's new coalition government which includes the National Religious Party has been approved by the Knesset by a 59-52 vote.

However, while the government gains the 10 NRP votes it loses the three it had from the Civil Rights Party because Shulamit Aloni's staunchly secular group refused to remain in the Cabinet with the NRP. In a last ditch effort Rabin had offered Ms. Aloni the post of Minister of Communications which she rejected.

Three veteran NRP leaders -- Yosef Burg,

Yitzhak Raphael and Michael Hazani -- have been sworn in as ministers of Interior, Religious Affairs and Welfare, respectively, the same portfolios they held in the last government of Premier Golda Meir. The new government now has a 66-54 margin in the Knesset.

But there is no certainty yet whether the government can count on the two "young guard" NRP Knesset members, Zevulun Hammer and Yehuda Ben Meir who have been adamant against the NRP joining the government. Hammer was offered a Cabinet post and rejected it.

MASS RALLY AGAINST TERROR

NEW YORK (WNS) -- An estimated 200,000 demonstrators filled Dag Hammarskjold Plaza opposite the United Nations at a mammoth "Rally for Humanity Against Arab Terror."

Speaker after speaker denounced the Palestine Liberation Organization and warned that recognition of the PLO by the United Nations would impede the search for peace in the Middle East. The rally was sponsored by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations.

Among those who addressed the huge crowd, the largest Jewish demonstration in the city's history, were: Moshe Dayan, former Israel Defense Minister, Abba Eban, former Israeli Foreign Mini-

ster, and Sen. Henry Jackson. Demonstrators carried signs declaring: "PLO is murder international," "Israel Yes, PLO No" and "Am Yisroel Chai."

More than 400 chartered buses from as far away as Bangor, Maine brought demonstrators to the rally. Others came by foot, subway, train, automobile, caravan and airplane. Jewish communities in 13 states were represented at the demonstrations, with large contingents from Boston and Philadelphia and other participants from as far away as Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Atlanta.

According to the sponsors of the rally, this was the biggest turnout of people in defense of Israel since the Jewish State was founded.
