NEW YORK -- The appointment of Rabbi David H. Panitz, spiritual leader of Temple Emanuel of Patterson, as Chairman of the Joint Commission on Rabbinic Placement under the auspices of The Jewish Theological Seminary of America, The Rabbinical Assembly and The United Synagogue of America was announced by Rabbi Mordecai Waxman, President of The Rabbinical Assembly.

PHILADELPHIA -- Dr. Haim Gervaryahu, an outstanding Biblical scholar, comes here from Israel to join the faculty at The Dropsie University.

LOS ANGELES -- A special effort to recruit qualified Jewish personnel for management positions in the American Telephone and Telegraph Company and its member companies is currently under way as a result of consultations between top officers of AT&T and representatives of the American Jewish Committee.

LOS ANGELES -- The executive head of the American Jewish Committee, Bertram H. Gold, cautioned that huge Arab investments in the U.S. economy, financed by skyrocketing oil income, might be giving the Arab states "the power to manipulate our economy, our diplomacy and our politics."

Stone, a 46-year-old lawyer and former Secretary of State in Florida and State Senator, defeated Republican Jack Eckard a drugstore chain owner and Dr. Dan Grady of the American

In the House, eleven incumbents were returned including Republican Benjamin Gilman and Democrat Bella Abzug, Elizabeth Holtzman, Edward I, Koch, Benjamin S, Rosenthal and Lester Wolff, all of New York; Democrats Joshua Eilberg, Pennsylvania; Edward Mezvinsky, Iowa; Sidney Yates, Illinois, and William Lehman, Florida, and Republican Sam Steiger, Arizona. The 12th incumbent, New York Democrat Bertram Podell withdrew from the race after involvement in criminal indictment but Democrat Stephen J. Solarz, a Jew, was elected to Podell's seat.

Democrats James Scheuer and Richard L. Ottinger in New York and Abner Mikvah in Illinois were elected to House seats they had previously held. Georgia elected a Jewish congressman for the first time, Democrat Elliott Levitas, who defeated a Republican incumbent in Atlanta's suburbs. In Maryland, Mrs. Gladys Noon Spellman, a Democrat of suburban Laurel, became the third Jewish woman to be elected to the new Congress. Other new Jewish congressmen are: Democrai Frederick Richmond, New York; Republican Willis D. Gradison, Ohio; and Democrats John R. Krebs and Henry A. Waxman, both California.
