

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- National Executive Council of American Jewish Committee called on the Ford Administration and the United States Congress to give urgent attention to the problems of rising unemployment.

NEW YORK -- "Hope for Humankind" was the topic when The Institute for Religious and Social Studies opened its 37th year at Jewish Theological Seminary.

LOS ANGELES -- "Joshua Kheel and Burton S. Levinson were elected to the National Commission of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith," announced Judge Robert Feinerman, president of ADL's Pacific Southwest Regional Board.

WASHINGTON, D. C. -- Dr. Norman E. Frimer, of Brooklyn, New York, has been appointed as international director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations effective January 1, 1975.

BEERSHEBA -- "The isolation of Israel," said world-famous playwright Friedrich Durrenmatt, "is a result of Europe's fear. Europe fears a possible loss of comfort. Is such a thing possible? -- For the second time in a century to be an accessory to a crime?"

NEW YORK -- To respond to recent international recognition of the PLO, and the effects of Arab oil policies, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America has expanded the program of its Thanksgiving Week national convention in Boca Raton, Florida, November 27 to December 1.

NEW YORK -- Senator Henry M. Jackson of Washington will be the principal speaker at the 60th Anniversary Meeting of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, December 12, 1974 at the New York Hilton Hotel.

LOS ANGELES -- An agronomy program of landmark significance, designed to prevent the now-threatened destruction of the world's essential cereal crops, is being undertaken by Tel Aviv University in Israel.

NEW YORK -- Twenty four major Catholic, Protestant, Evangelical, and Black church leaders have accused the Palestine Liberation Organization of "shattering the hopes for peace nurtured by peoples and nations around the globe" and of making a "mockery of the principles and ideals" of the United Nations, in a N. Y. Times ad.

BALTIMORE, MD. -- William Braiterman, member of the Presidium of the Veterans of the Judean Battalions, will be the guest speaker at the annual re-union meeting of the Palestine Jewish Legion Veterans December 1 at the Central Synagogue Community Center, 123 East 55th Street, New York City.

NEW YORK -- L'CHAIM -- TO LIFE!, Women's American ORT's monumental documentary on the life of the Russian Jews over the last century, has been awarded a silver plaque at the 1974 Chicago International Film Festival.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The death of a 16-year-old Arab girl, scores of injuries and up to 50 arrests were the results of pro-terrorist rioting by high school students on the West Bank following Yasir Arafat's UN speech.

CHICAGO (WNS) -- "A foolish and futile attempt to split the Jewish people and the State of Israel," was the way Pinhas Sapir, chairman of the Jewish Agency Executive, described the speech of Yasir Arafat, head of the PLO.

ROME (WNS) -- Pope Paul granted a private audience to a representative of the Palestine Liberation Organization, Gibreel Shukri, and his wife.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli naval units shelled a terrorist base at Tashidiya on the Lebanese coast after a clash between an Israeli beach patrol and two terrorists who had infiltrated into Israel by sea.
