the killers of Israeli athletes in Munich and children in Maalot had no place in international diplomatic efforts. "Israel," he said, "will pursue the PLO murderers until justice is meted out to them."

"It will continue to take action against their organization and against their bases until a definitive end is put to their atrocities. The blood of Jewish children will not be shed with impunity. Israel will not permit the establishment of PLO authority in any part of Palestine. The PLO will not be forced on the Palestinian Arabs. It will not be tolerated by the Jews of Israel," said Tekoah. Quoting a variety of statements from PLO sources, Israel's Ambassador to the U.N. said that the PLO's ultimate goal was the destruction of Israel and its replacement by an Arab state. Many delegations, including the U.S., reacted coolly to the bluster and showmanship around Arafat's visit.

John Scali, the U.S. Ambassador to the UN, remained seated when other delegates rose to greet and applaud Arafat's arrival into the Assembly chamber.

ROME, ITALY -- Senator Hubert H. Humphrey, who is serving as a congressional advisor to the U.S. delegation at the United Nations' world food conference, said "General Brown's statements were shocking, outrageous and totally without foundation. They do a great disservice to our country, the American Jewish community and Israel."

WASHINGTON -- Senator Walter F. Mondale (D. Minn.) said he is "outraged" over what he termed General George S. Brown's "incredibly insensitive" remarks about the influence of the American Jewish community.

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Congress accused the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff of "virulent anti-Semitism" and called on President Ford to determine "whether it is fitting" for General George S. Brown "to continue to serve in his present capacity."

FORD WILL NOT DISMISS GEN. BROWN

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Ford reaffirmed that he will not dismiss Gen. George S. Brown, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, despite the storm that erupted in the wake of the General's anti-Semitic and anti-Israel slurs.

Ford made this statement in answer to a question at a press conference in Phoenix, Arizona. He told the conference that he had rebuked Brown earlier in the day when he called

ed the four star Air Force General into the Oval Room at the White House.

Ford also repeated to the press conference his earlier statement that he disapproved and disavowed Brown's statement.

The President noted, however, that Brown had apologized and that he was an "excellent chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. I don't think he should be fired for one mistake."

PROTEST BROWN'S ANTI-SEMITIC REMARKS

WASHINGTON, D.C. (WNS) -- A national storm is brewing over the anti-Semitic and anti-Israel remarks of General George S. Brown, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, for his allegations that American Jews and Israel exert undue influence on American policy.

The furor developed after it was learned that the four-star general replying to questions after addressing a group at Duke University Law School in Durham, N.C., October 10 on the possibility of American military intervention in the event of a second Arab oil embargo, he said that Jews exerted too much influence in Congress

because Jews "own, you know, the banks in this country, the newspapers."

In a late-breaking development, President Ford personally rebuked Brown at a face-to-face meeting with the General at the White House.

Congressmen, Jewish and non-Jewish leaders called on Ford to remove Brown from the nation's highest military post. In fact a congressional investigation may take place when Congress returns from its election recess.

"Brown must go," said Sen. William Proxmire, Democrat from Wisconsin.

The views of the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, whose chairman is Roy Wilkins, head of the NAACP, were expressed in a telegram to Ford. The telegram called into question Brown's fitness to serve "as the highest officer in a democracy."

Gentlemen:

General George S. Brown has acknowledged that he stated that Jews "own, you know, the banks in this country, the newspapers" during a question and answer session on October 10, 1974, following a speech attended by about 150 people at the Duke University Law School forum in Durham, North Carolina. These comments, at first blush, remind us of the statements of a now exposed gubernatorial candidate in this state that the inflation problems of the world were caused by international bankers. We know who he meant by the phrase international bankers.

The comments of General Brown reduce his character to that of exposed and discredited local Ponzis. We should be able to attach as little credence and importance to the General's comments as to the protestations of innocence and repertorial abuse of the abundantly unsuccessful candidate.

It is unfortunate and regrettable for all of us that even though General George S. Brown, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff has the same low and base character, limited intelligence, prejudice, bias, ignorance, and total unfitness as our recent unsuccessful and impotent candidate, we cannot rank them alike.

The General is the most important military man in this country and except for the President, controls every weapon at the disposal of the United States Government. He is a discredit to the nation that elevated him to that position. His presence as Chairman of Joint Chiefs of Staff is an imminent danger to this country because of his October 10, 1974 statements, he demonstrates lack of judgment which we are entitled to expect. His untrue remarks are an insult and his presence in the armed services is insulting. The Uniform Code of Military Justice should be explored to determine if there are not sufficient grounds to dismiss him from the service of the country he has dishonored.
