

MIDEAST PEACE QUEST: ALLON TO WASHINGTON, KISSINGER TO ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The next stage in the quest for peace in the Middle East has been set with the announcement in Jerusalem and Washington that Foreign Minister Yigal Allon will go to Washington December 9.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Ismail Fahmy is expected to follow Allon to the U.S. and sometime after that Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger is expected to make his ninth trip to the Mideast. The agenda for the upcoming talks will include a second-stage settlement in Sinai.

Israel still insists that the settlement be political, a clear step toward peace, while Egypt wants a military settlement, in line with the disengagement agreement of last January.

Meanwhile officials here were reported "encouraged" by the tone and wording of the references to the Middle East by President Ford and Soviet Communist Party Secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev at Vladivostok. However, there was no official comment in Jerusalem.

In the Ford-Brezhnev communique both sides expressed "their concern with regard to the dangerous situation" in the Middle East and "reaffirmed their intention to take every effort to promote a solution of the key issues of a just and lasting peace in that area on the basis of UN resolution 338, with due account taken of the legitimate interests of all people of the area including the Palestinian people, and respect for the right of all the states of the area to independent existence."

Both sides agreed that "the Geneva conference should play an important part in the establishment of a just and lasting peace in the Middle East and should resume its work as soon as possible." The communique was viewed in Jerusalem to mean that the two superpowers would continue to cooperate in the Mideast which in the short run should prevent another Israeli-Arab war.

In Washington observers also saw the communique as moving closer to the Moscow view that the two superpowers should impose a peace on the Mideast.

SENATORS SUPPORT ISRAEL EXPLORATIONS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Senators Edward Kennedy (D. Mass.) and Gale McGee (D. Wyo.) have urged the State Department to oppose the Arab and Communist proposed resolution calling on UNESCO to terminate funds to Israel unless the Jewish state ceases archaeological explorations in Jerusalem.

They urged the U.S. to "aggressively" line up votes against the adoption of the resolution.

Senator Clifford P. Case (R. N.J.) said the UNESCO resolution is "baseless" since Israel treats fairly all historical treasures, whether Arab, Hebrew or Christian.

FORMER ATTY. GEN. WORKING FOR ALGERIA

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- U. S. Department of Justice records reveal that former U. S. Attorney General Richard S. Kleindienst, who identified himself in his reports filed under the U.S. Foreign Agents Registration Act as an attorney, said he was engaged in "general professional legal services on a continuing basis for the govern-

ment of Algeria" and that he "also participated, with others, in making arrangements by which officers of the government of Algeria met with officers of the government of the United States."

In a report last May, Kleindienst denied issuing or preparing political propaganda.

Israelite Ads Pay

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Grants for Israel totaling \$439.5 million along with another \$200 million in credits have been approved by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

The appropriation now must be approved by the full Senate.

A look at the bill shows that more grants are going to Arab states than to Israel. Egypt will be getting \$250 million in grants, Jordan \$87 million in economic aid and \$125 million in military assistance as grants and \$100 million is earmarked for "the Middle East"

which is expected to go to Syria, Lebanon will get a grant of \$150,000 and Saudi Arabia \$220,000.
