

**NO SENATE INQUIRY INTO GEN. BROWN**

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- "We have disposed of the Gen Brown matter," Sen. John D. Stennis (D. Mass), chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, told newsmen after the committee voted 11-4 against holding an inquiry into Gen. George S. Brown's fitness to continue as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Sen. Thomas J. McIntyre (D. NH) had submitted the resolution asking for an inquiry into Brown's fitness because of his remarks at Duke University Law School in which Brown said American Jews owned most of the banks and newspapers and that Israel has undue in-

fluence on Congress. McIntyre's motion was backed by three other Democrats, Henry M. Jackson of Washington, Stuart Symington of Missouri and Harold E. Hughes of Iowa.

One of the senators who voted against the probe, Robert Taft, Jr. (R. Ohio) submitted a resolution to call Defense Secretary James R. Schlesinger before the committee to explain why Brown should not resign. This was defeated by a 10-3 vote.

Stennis noted the "severe reprimand" President Ford administered to Brown, saying, "The General has apologized and been reprimanded and there is nothing for the

Committee to do." McIntyre said he wanted a "specific inquiry" into "how deep seated are opinions expressed by Brown."

Meanwhile in a speech at the Comstock Club in Sacramento, California, Brown made his fourth public statement of "concern" over his remarks and apologized for "having unintentionally offended my fellow Americans, not merely Americans of the Jewish faith." He said that since his remark, he had "received some letters of support of a type I totally reject as alien to America and alien to me. Polarization in our society is contrary to our traditions and clearly not in the best interests of our nation," Brown said.

**4 COMMUNITIES, 2 ORGANIZATION GET SHRODER AWARDS**  
CHICAGO, ILL. -- Four American Jewish communities and two national Jewish organizations will be presented with 1974 William J. Shroder Awards, the highest service honor bestowed by the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds upon Jewish communal agen-

cies, at the banquet highlighting its forty-third General Assembly on Saturday evening, November 16, at the Palmer House. The communities honored include Cleveland, Ohio, in the large city category; Milwaukee, Wisconsin, among the intermediate size cities; Madison, Wisconsin, in the small city group, and the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the National Jewish Welfare Board and the Jewish Community Center of Greater Minneapolis, Minnesota, with a special award for their combined consultative services to the Jewish community of Rome, Italy.

The Jewish Federation of Cleveland, of which Morton L. Mandel is president, Henry L. Zucker, executive vice president, and Sidney Z. Vincent, executive director, is being honored "for its initiative and planning to help stabilize and assure continuity of a Jewish neighborhood" (Cleveland Heights).

The Milwaukee Jewish Federation, of which Max H. Karl is president and Melvin S. Zaret, executive vice president, receive the award for its "innovative inter-agency service to youth, college students and the elderly."
