

right. On the other hand, Mrs. Gross outlined the high and responsible position of women in the eyes of Jewish law and custom, and the substantial role which she is called upon to play within the Jewish family and in Jewish society. Mrs. Gross did approve of the heightened sense of communal responsibility which the feminist movement has evoked among Jewish women, and viewed it as a return to the values of conduct encouraged by the Torah way of life. Otherwise, she considered Jewish women as having always been liberated, with respect to modern standards, and felt no need for Orthodox Jewry to alter its traditional approach to the role or stature of women.
