ment should end the dispute between Likud and the government over whether Egypt was the "moderate" among Israel's foes. Mapam general secretary Meir Talmi said if Fahmy's statement was Egyptian policy it clearly "closed the options."

In Washington, State Department officials said they were not surprised at Fahmy's remarks because "99 percent was old" but expressed concern at their timing -- just when Allon was returning to Jerusalem after a week of talks in Washington designed to promote a second stage of negotiations with Egypt.

Meanwhile in New York, former Israeli Premier Golda Meir speaking to 3000 delegates to the United Jewish Appeal National Conference, scornfully denounced Fahmy's statement. Later on CBS-TV's "Face the Nation," Mrs. Meir said she hoped Fahmy "hadn't talked this nonsense just to give a sign to Americans that unless something drastic is done against Israel then there can be no peace, no negotiations." She noted that three generations of Israelis have fought wars and spilled blood, "for what, not to let a Jew come in for 50 years, or for five years or for five days?" Israel cannot enter negotiations when such demands are made, she said.

CEASE-FIRE ON PROPAGANDA STATEMENTS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Undersecretary of State for Political Affairs Joseph J. Sisco has called for a "cease-fire" on the kind of "propaganda statement" such as made by Egyptian Foreign Minister Ismail Fahmy when he demanded that Israel halt immigration for 50 years and return to the 1947 partition boundaries. Addressing a meeting of the Greater Washington Jewish Community Foundation at the Jewish Community Center here, Sisco said he would not take Fahmy's statement "seriously" but such remarks are "hardly helpful in creating the kind of climate which we (the United States) think is required." He said that "We have

tried to advise both the Arabs as well as the Israelis to downplay and to say as little as possible with respect to the other side and the reason we have done this is that we understand that a number of these statements made by one side or another at a given time is for domestic -- consump-

tion."

Sisco defended the American step-by-step diplomacy as "the only practicable approach" to a final peace settlement in the Mideast. He noted that "we are convinced that if we try to approach the solution of the Arab-Israeli dispute on an overall, across-the-board basis, it is too complicated to achieve this kind of overall re-

sult." He said "he was convinced that the U.S. must build during the next six months on the momentum achieved by the disengagement agreements.

In another development, Egyptian President Anwar Sadat said the Mideast is a bomb ready to explode.

everything that is decent and moral in human life." Mrs. Meir stressed that she believes the future "existence of the Jewish people depends upon an Israel safe, alive and developing. If you believe that, then everything is worthwhile," she said.

Jewish Agency Treasurer Leon Dulzin told the UJA leaders that Israel is short \$3 billion to cover the \$8 billion cost of the Yom Kippur War. He said Israel still "suffers from the consequences of that war." Noting that there is a possibility of a new war, Dulzin said Israel spends 35 percent of its GNP on defense, the highest percentage in the world. "The burden is heavy," he said, "it is difficult, but we are strong."

The UJA National conference elected Frank F. Lautenberg, of Montclair, New Jersey, president of Automatic Data Processing, Inc., of Clifton, N.J., as its new general chairman, succeeding Paul Zuckerman of Detroit.

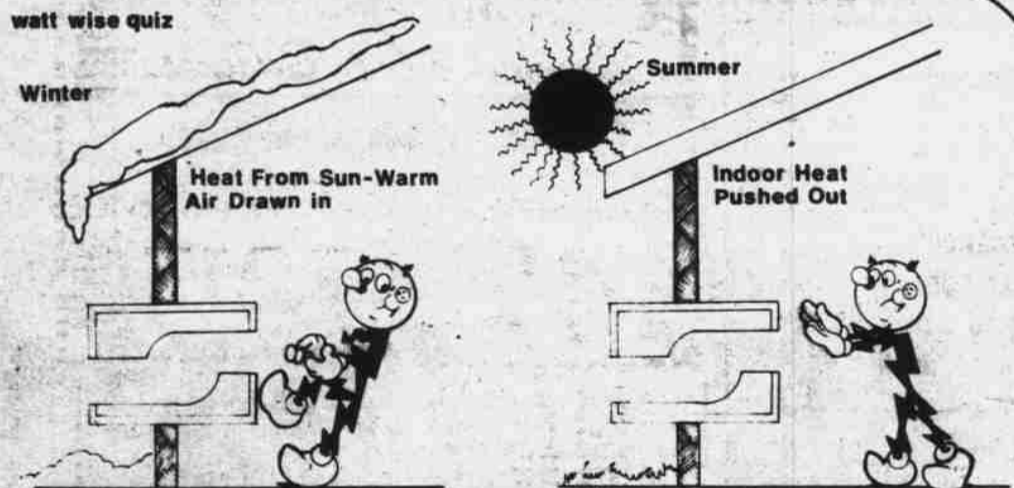
