

DIRECT SOVIET ARMS PIPELINE TO PLO

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A direct pipeline of Soviet weapons to the Palestine Liberation Organization has been established as a result of the recent visit to Moscow by PLO leader Yasir Arafat, it was learned here.

The weapons are said to include the latest model Kalchnikof automatic assault rifle, which can fire grenades up to 250 meters; and the mobile aircraft missiles and launchers known at the "Strela" or "SAM - 7" which can be carried with a shoulder harness.

Reliable sources also

report that the terrorists are making a serious effort to establish bases in Jordan to be used for attacks against Israel as well as King Hussein's regime. Jordan is attempting to counteract these attempts.

ISRAELI MISSING AFTER RAID ON TERRORISTS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Israeli soldier was reported missing after Israeli forces raided Tabieh village in southern Lebanon killing an unspecified number of terrorists in a gun battle and destroying the building in which the terrorists were sheltered.

A military spokesman said the soldier, Nissim Itzhak, lost his footing and fell into a ravine. Search parties failed to

find him. Israel has asked the Red Cross to continue the search.

Defense Minister Shimon Peres warned that Israel "will continue to act as we have in the past -- to hit the (terrorist) bases, and if they get into Israel, to deal with them here." He urged the Lebanese government not to listen to urgings by other Arab states to allow the use of its territory for incursions into Israel. "That will endanger Lebanon more than help it," he said.

CAMPAIGN FOR RELEASE OF MOSCOW TEENAGER

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry has launched a nationwide campaign for the release of Marina Tiemkin, a Moscow Jewish teenager who

was kidnapped last year by KGB agents and brought to a "youth camp" many miles from her home after she publicly stated her desire to emigrate to Israel.

The campaign spearheaded by the Brooklyn SSSJ, was launched at Manhattan's Lincoln square Synagogue. A letter was read from Marina's father, Dr.

"Marina's torments are the revenge of pogrom-makers for her Jewish pride and her passionate desire to live in our homeland,"

LAKE HIAWATHA, N.J. (WNS) -- Several girls were injured slightly by flying glass when an explosive object was tossed into the Lake Hiawatha Jewish Center as 200 delegates were attending a weekend area convention of the United Synagogue youth.

Rabbi Herman Savitz,

spiritual leader of the Center in suburban Morris County, said the explosion did not prevent the convention from continuing.

He said the Jewish Center, which also houses a synagogue for a congregation of 400 families, had recently been smeared by hand-painted swastikas and anti-Jewish obscenities.
