NATL. JEWISH HOSP. HONORS CHARLES RICH AT DUNES FEB. 16

Charles J. Rich, an executive with the Dunes Hotel and Country Club, will receive the second annual Honor Award of the Las Vegas Friends of National Jewish Hospital and Research Center at a testimonial dinner dance Sunday, February 16, in the Crown Jewel Ballroom of the Dunes Hotel.

Mel Exber, president and general manager of the Las Vegas Club, who is chairman of the dinner dance, said Rich had been chosen for the coveted award because of "his many distinguished activities on behalf of Las Vegas and the State of Nevada as well as his humanitarian interest and aid to the National Jewish Hospital." The first recipient of the Honor Award last year was Governor Mike O'Callaghan.

Nevada residents of all faiths have received almost 7,000 days of care, most of them free, at the world-famed hospital, regardless of race, age or ability to pay. NJH, the only hospital in the country which treats asthma victims from infancy to old age, is a pioneer center for treatment and research of tuberculosis, emphysema, cystic fibrosis, and asthma and allied respiratory ailments and immunological disorders.
