JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Ra-bin told the 500 delegates to the Sixth Plenary Assembly of the World Jewish Congress that Israel fully supports Secretary of State Kissin-ger's step-by-step approach as the "hest and most realistic method" of working toward a settlement of the Middle East conflict. Rabin said Israel would question Kissinger as to the significance of recent public state-ments by Egyptian President Anwar Sadat that Israel, He said if Sadat is sincere his pledge should be incorporated into a formal written agreement with Israel. If Sadat did this, Rabin said, it would represent "a new opening... a great chance" for progress toward a full peace settlement in the Middle East. Meanwhile in Washington, Kissinger said

settlement in the Middle East, Meanwhile in Washington, Kissinger said his nine-day visit to the Middle Fast and West Europe culminating with talks with Soviet For-eign Minister Andrei Gromyko in Geneva will be "one of exploration, I don't expect to settle anything on this trip." Kissinger is scheduled to go to Israel, Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Saudi Arabia and Bonn and then meet with Gromyko in Geneva, Gromy-ko has just completed a visit to Syria, Iraq and Egypt.

ko has just completed a visit to syria, fraq and Egypt. At the WJC session, Rabin said if Kissinger's step-by-step approach failed, there would be no alternative but to go to Geneva peace conference. He said even if the American approach failed, Israel would have re-enforced its relations with Washington and the military strengthening of Washington and the military strengthening of Israel would continue.

Earlier Rabin told the Knessei that Israel's military strength has increased substantially since the Yom Kippur War and even if Egypt received the weapons it has requested from the Soviet Union, the balance of power would not become worse this year.

Rabin declared, "It is high time for the Soviet Union to Stop Ignoring Israel "

Not long ago Greenspun stated if he was under oath, being cross-examined on the witness stand and was asked certain questions he would punch the questioner in the face. On a previous occasion, when Greenspun himself was in the witness box, he blurted out to the cross examiner: "Don't ask me that question. You'll be sorry if you do." This from a newspaper publisher, no less, who also happens to be a lawyer.

less, who also happens to be a lawyer. Greenspun's most recent eruption came about because a network television show about the life of Howard Hughes deleted an interview with Greenspun. According to the producer of the show Greenspun's portion was eliminated com-pletely because the network and an insurance company considered the material libelous, The show, entitled "In Search of Howard Hughes," and labeled an unauthorized biography, was a fascinating depiction of one of the most outstanding success stories in American history. Not only did Hughes run a half million into more than two billion, but in doing so he established a reputation as a rugged indivi-
