

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The time is not yet ripe for Israel to produce specific ideas on the next stage of negotiations with Egypt, Foreign Minister Yigal Allon told the Cabinet.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Arab engineer from Nablis, who was sentenced by a military tribunal to eight years imprisonment for being a member of the Jordanian Communist Party's military arm, told the tribunal the Soviet Union was maintaining a terrorist training base for persons from West Bank towns in the USSR.

NEW YORK -- Israeli teachers were engaged in 54 Jewish schools in 40 U. S. communities last year through the American Association for Jewish Education's Exchange Visitors Program.

JERUSALEM -- Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg, president of the American Jewish Congress, this week proposed a three-point program for Jewish survival that would give every Jewish child a free Jewish education, create a Jewish peace corps for service to the community and make Jewish study "as important as political rallies and fundraising events."

NEW YORK -- Sixty five Yeshiva High School seniors and ten prospective teachers left for a semester of study in Israel sponsored by the Torah Education Department of the World Zionist Organization - American Section.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- There are "encouraging signs" that the 1975 United Jewish Appeal Campaign will exceed that of 1974. Frank Lautenberg, UJA's general chairman told a meeting of Israeli newspaper editors.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The major challenge facing the World Jewish Congress is the forging of new and effective ways to strengthen relations between Israel and the diaspora, Dr. Gerhart M. Riegner, the WJC's director general told a press conference.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The possibility that a large quantity of sacramental wine made in Israel and exported for Passover use may not be "Kosher l'Pesach" is being investigated by the Chief Rabbinate.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- At the urging of the Canadian Jewish Congress, the Canadian government has pledged to examine proposals to crack down on former Nazi war criminals who obtained Canadian citizenship by concealing their past.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A report by the Ministry of Interior shows a steady Jewish emigration from the Galilee which could lead to an Arab majority in that area if the trend is not reversed.

NEW YORK -- Dr. Gurston Goldin has been appointed guest lecturer, and Dr. Samuel Klagsbrun visiting lecturer in the department of pastoral psychiatry of The Jewish Theological Seminary of America.

NEW YORK -- The Swiss Government contributed 145,500 pounds of powdered milk to the Joint Distribution Committee during 1974.

NEW YORK -- Supplemental English language classes for Russian Jewish newcomers have been organized by community groups throughout the Greater New York area in cooperation with the New York Association for New Americans.

NEW YORK -- Charles Berlin, head of Harvard College Library - Hebrew Department has called on the American Jewish community to establish a Bibliographic and Documentation Center for Judaea as a basic step in developing Jewish library resources in the U.S.

NEW YORK -- It is important "not only for the sake of Israel, but also in order to strengthen and deepen its own Jewish identity, so intrinsically linked with Israel's destiny," that North American Jewry "develop a consensus on the desirability and necessity of aliyah," Mr. Pinhas Sapir declared in Jerusalem as he announced the second annual "Aliyah Month."
