first remarkable success politically when it mobilized American public opinion in support of a joint resolution of the United States Congress on September 22, 1922 endorsing the Balfour Declaration and the idea of Jewish National Home.

During World War II, the ZOA was responsible for the Zionist Emergency Council, led by its gifted leadership of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, who also led the political battle in 1947 for the creation and the recognition of the State of Israel.

In the twenty-six years of Israel's statehood which followed, the ZOA, as with all the other Jewish Organizations, worked for rebuilding and maintaining the home for Jewish people in Israel, as well as to strengthen the Jewish Community in the United States.
