

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Oved Ben-Ami, former mayor of Natanya and a leader of the Society for an Undivided Israel (Eretz Israel Hashle-mah), has proposed an international Jewish 'parliament' representing the partnership between Israeli and diaspora Jews.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- High school students will be allowed to work in border settlements with their parents' consent to ease the burden of the settlers who are saddled with guard duty and other security jobs in addition to their normal work.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Officials of Histadrut and the Histadrut Sick Fund, Kupat Holim, are trying to trace an alleged million-dollar donation that was supposed to have endowed a special wing at Beersheba Hospital in the name of Mayor Steven Clark, of Miami, Florida.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Some 700 leading rabbis and laymen from Orthodox communities throughout the world concluded their third World Conference of Synagogues and Kehilot by denouncing the bill before the Knesset which would liberalize Israel's abortion laws.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A joint consultation committee has been formed by the American Jewish Committee and the B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League to meet the need for increased cooperation at a time when "emerging Arab power challenges the political security of Israel and poses threats to many other segments of the world Jewish community."

NEW YORK (WNS) Sens. Jacob K. Javits (R. NY) and Harrison A. Williams (D. NJ) have asked President Ford to investigate the attempts by the Arabs to extend their anti-Israel boycott to banking firms with Jewish members.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israel's industrial output in 1974 totaled \$1.25 billion, 15 percent more than 1973.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Youth Aliya movement is increasingly concerning itself with the rehabilitation of children of deprived families in Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Some 500 Bedouins, endangered by flash floods in the northern Sinai, were rescued by Israeli army units using helicopters.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- In an effort to find oil on both inland and off-shore sites, Israel will invest large sums of money, according to discussions before the Knesset's Economic Committee.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- One terrorist was killed as an Israeli patrol prevented a Palestine terrorist gang from entering Israel in the Shetula area of Upper Galilee. There were no Israeli casualties.

PHILADELPHIA -- Judge Paul Ribner, national commander of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A., is heading a group of JWV leaders on a 10-day convocation to Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel is capable of defending itself under any circumstances except in the case of a superpower actively arrayed against her. Premier Yitzhak Rabin told students at Bar Ilan University.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Calling for a manifestation of "practical Zionism," Defense Minister Shimon Peres told the Jerusalem Economic Club that Jerusalem must be surrounded with a chain of settlements and Jewish industrial enterprises.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel and Jordanian leaders, including King Hussein, met several times between 1967 and 1973, former Defense Minister Moshe Dayan disclosed, but they failed to work out an agreement because Hussein demanded Israeli pull-backs that were unacceptable.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Sephardic Chief Rabbi Ofadia Yosef has ruled that Israeli wines are permissible for Passover despite certain doubts recently cast on their kashrut.
