(Fifth term Assemblyman Zel Lowman, who served as Majority Floor Leader, is a member of Judiciary, Education and Health & Welfare committees. As President of Southern Nevada Drug Abuse Council, he is considered a hard-liner on law enforcement.)

As a result of 100% support of the Rocky Mountain Association of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons which met for three days in an annual meeting at Lake Tahoe, AB 36 which forbids liquid silicone injections into the body of anyone in Nevada had clear sailing through the Assembly Judiciary Committee and the Lower House itself.

If the work of the Assembly Education Committee is approved by both Houses, AB 24 should result in the closure and future control of "diploma mills" in Nevada.

Some 45 bills and resolutions were dropped into the hopper during the week, some in the Senate and some in the Assembly, from the interim study on legislative reform.

A reform measure for the Nevada Supreme Court making its second appearance in the Assembly, a procedure necessary before going on the ballot for voting by the electorate, was lost on the Floor of the Lower House as a number of Assemblymen arose to oppose it. It would have allowed voters to decide whether or not Supreme Court Justices could be appointed by the Governor after nomination from select committees and serve their first term before being voted on for re-election.

March 3 has been set for the hearing on AB 17 and AB 51, measures to prohibit smoking in public places in the State.

Robert Benkovich, Assemblyman from Reno, dropped into the hopper a controversial proposal to lower penalties for youth under 21 years of age who are arrested for possession of marijuana to receive a fine rather than be charged with a felony upon conviction.
