NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Israel Miller, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, has suggested that Israel's stand in the negotiations that were con-ducted by Secretary ducted by Sec of State Henry Kissinger may have been proven correct by the situation Vietnam.

While charging that the Arab world's refusal to accept Israel's right to exist responsible for Kissinger's failure, Rabbi Miller said the failure. wisdom of Israel's insistence on tangible peace moves by Egypt before relinquishing "is conterritory what is today in firmed by happening Vietnam." There He noted too. Kissinger Secretary served as a mediator among the local par-ties to the conflict," and "there too, pled-ges of peaceful inges of peaceful were offertentions ed without necessary safeguards to make sure the pro-mises would not be

broken." Rabbi Miller said "Israel has learned the lesson of Vietnam and both the American people and the cause of peace are the gainers. He said "It is clear now that by its refusal to rebelligerency nounce against Israel, Egypt

and the Arab world are not yet ready to accept Israel's right to exist as a legitimate and permanent political entity in the Middle East.'

Rabbi Miller pledged.
"unity and solidarity
with Israel in her struggle for peace and security." He ad-vised that "Now is the time for Israel to stand fast and cool. For Israel's friends in this country, it is a moment to speak out in solidarity with the Jewish State, recognizing that peace can-not be achieved by surrender nor security with probought mises."

Meanwhile the Zionist Organization America and United Zionists -- Revisionists of America sent telegrams to President Ford urging him to reaffirm American commitment Israel's security, ZOA president, Dr. Joseph P. Sternstein, urged Ford not to abandon America's "loyal ally" and blamed the Arab intransigence intransigence aided by the Kremlin for Egypt's rejection of moderation, Re-visionists president Howard Adelson noted "with dismay reports that you (Ford) place responsibility" for the failure of the mission of Israel. "Egypt-ian refusal to take steps toward a poli-tical solution made failure inevitable."
