

NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK FREEBIES

April 12th through April 19th has been designated National Library Week and libraries across the country are planning various activities to stimulate library use. Programs for Clark County Library patrons include a week that is fine-free,

paint - ins, concerts, movies and lectures. The annual young people's Paint - In and brown bag lunch begins the week's activities on Saturday, April 12th at 11 a.m. on the front lawn of the Flamingo Library. Children can paint their favorite story book characters on large billboards while Uncle Doogie, the clown, entertains. Participants are invited to bring a brown bag lunch and eat on the lawn while the Space Barricade, an atmospheric sky sculpture, is launched above the library at 1 p.m.

In order to stimulate the return of overdue library books the library has designated April 13th through 19th as fine free. In cooperation with the library's efforts to have books returned, all local MacDonald's and 7-11 stores have offered to assist. Any patron returning overdue books to MacDonald's during the week will receive a certificate for a free hamburger. Tuesday, April 15th at the West Las Vegas Library, 1402 N. "D" Street with a repeat performance on Wednesday, April 16th at the Flamingo Library, 1401 E. Flamingo Road.

Children's yoga classes will be

conducted on the afternoons of April 16th and 17th. Pre-registration is required in the Young People's Department.

This Week in Carson City

(Fifth term Assemblyman Zel Lowman, who served as Majority Floor Leader, is a member of Judiciary, Education and Health & Welfare committees. As President of Southern Nevada Drug Abuse Council, he is considered a hard-liner on law enforcement.)

The relief for Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital and the Vegas Valley Mass Transit problem are still in various stages of hearings. However, the special Transit Committee, under Chairman Tom Hickey, had hearings in both Carson City and Las Vegas.

In Assembly Judiciary, AB 313 would have allowed 18-year-olds to drink and gamble was defeated 5-2 and is apparently dead for this session. However, the proposal to liberalize possession of marijuana for the same age group was still in committee without action.

After being defeated 20-15 in the Lower House, AB 17 which prohibits smoking in certain public places including buses and health facilities was reconsidered and passed 25-13. It now goes to an uncertain fate in the Senate.

Amendments were proposed for the bill to allow medical treatment of minors without parental consent included the ability of an emancipated minor to give consent for health care services but not to consent to sterilization.

The Assembly passed bill which offers voters an opportunity to indicate a vote of no-confidence in any of the candidates in Presidential elections.

Additional bills aimed at helping to solve the malpractice crisis for Nevada physicians were ready for introduction.
