

HANK THORNLEY FOR MAYOR

When veteran newsman Hank Thornley filed for the position of Mayor of Las Vegas he promised a positive, no-nonsense campaign that would tackle the issues head-on. If elected, he vowed the position would not serve as a stepping stone for any future political office. "If I win I will stay as long as the people think I'm doing a good job."

"To consider the Mayor's job anything less than full-time would be demeaning to the city and the people," Thornley said. "Las Vegas is a big city and demands full-time service."

Thornley resigned his position as News Director at KSHO-TV early in March when he became the first candidate to announce for Mayor. He could have kept his job and just gone off the air but he felt resigning as News Director would demonstrate his total commitment to the Mayor's job before and after the race.

The candidate also believes the Mayor should be an aggressive spokesman for the city and should push hard for new business. "I believe the Mayor should play a major role in stimulating the economy," Thornley said. "This

means more and bigger conventions, more general tourism, and a strong effort to bring major new businesses to Southern Nevada."

"In every case this means the Mayor must be a qualified spokesman for the City, and I believe I have the background and ability to serve in this capacity."

Thornley also spoke out on the issues of consolidation, illegal aliens, Nevada Power Company and massage parlors.

On consolidation Thornley feels, "Any plan which does not involve going to the people is not a good plan. In the case of annexation or consolidation we are talking about changing our present form of government. The very essence of our democratic system says the people should have a voice in that decision."

Thornley sees the issue of illegal aliens as an economic problem and those who are in this country illegally and holding jobs should be made to leave. "We desperately need jobs for our local, legal residents. If the government doesn't move fast enough, I favor legal action against the U.S. government if necessary."

Like most Southern Nevadans, Thornley is extremely concerned about repetitive rate increases charged by the Power Company.

He feels the power company needs "to get its house in order" and would oppose any more long term franchises. The possibility of municipal ownership should also receive a thorough investigation according to Thornley.

Long known for "telling it like it is," Thornley also lashed out at the massage parlors. Thornley pointed out it was a matter of public record he had tried to restrict massage parlors when serving as City Commissioner, but his plan for restricted licenses was voted down.

"No one has a better record of opposing these kinds of businesses," Thornley said. "I have always opposed them, and I always will."

While serving as City Commissioner from 1969-73 Thornley was selected as Mayor Pro Tem.

He has also served the community as Chairman of the Regional Parks and Recreation Commission, Vice Chairman of the Convention and Visitors Authority, Vice Chairman of the Regional Streets and Highway Commission and Vice Chairman of the Southern Nevada Human Relations Commission.

Thornley is a past president of Sigma Delta Chi, has a long list of state and regional awards for his outstanding news work and community service, is a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie #1213 as well as the Las Vegas Press Club.

Married for 36 years, Hank and Marian have five children and eight grandchildren. The Thornleys reside at 2009 El Greco here in Las Vegas.
