Appearing Arnold madcap comedian George Gobel and The Establishment,

Arnold has been making and breaking records for more than twenty and is currently listed among the four recording top tists of all time. His total record sales re-cently exceeded the 70,000,000 mark.

In 1966, he was elected to the Country Music Hall of Fame, a fitting tribute to the man who has personally brought country music millions of people all over the world. The following year, he was named "Enter-tainer of the Year" by the Country Music Association.

Eddy refers to himself as "a Heinz 57 singer -- I sing many different kinds of songs which mean kinds something to different kinds of people. Whateverthe mixture, Eddy's songs

If Eddy's singing and performance have become more cosmo-politan, more tradi-tionally "pop" they have, nevertheless, retained the down-toearth quality of the Country genre. The music, like the man, is a rare synthesis of the rural and the urban, the folksy and the sophisticated. It is, perhaps, this com-bination which ac-counts for Eddy's enormous universal appeal, both as performer and human being.
