Carlino, 48, braved the wind and cool temperatures to hold an unusual press conference at the intersection of Second and Fremont. Carlino said he chose the street-corner idea because "This is where it begins. I am going to speak with every Las Vegan I can, to learn their views and to explain my own."

Carlino did not know the cost of his personal contact campaign, but predicted high shoe leather costs.

A former Democratic state chairman, Carlino was unsuccessful during the past state election in a bid for Secretary of State. Carlino did not see the bid for mayor as a second choice in the voters' eyes. "There are others in the same boat," he said. "If I had my choice I'd rather be mayor than secretary of state," he said.
