Terry said he feels particular-ly qualified to represent Ward 3 due to his lifetime involvement with the area, a district he says has certain problems not faced in other districts. One problem involves representation for a large percentage of senior citizens and others on limited income who feel they have never had anyone in the past to be their spokesman. Another issue is the proposed expressway connecting Las Vegas Blvd. North, and the Boulder Highway which would run through Ward 3 and disrupt large areas of residential hous-

Terry also expressed concern about increased crime, and called for a substantial increase in police protection. Consolida-tion is an issue Terry said he personally opposes because "smaller units of government are much more responsive to people." Also, the consolida-tion issue should be decided by the people of Las Vegas.


