250,000 SALUTE ISRAEL MYC PARADE

NEW YORK (WNS) Israel's 27th anniversary was marked here with the 11th annual "Salute to Israel" parade sponsored by the Ameri-can Zionist Youth Federations. An 250,000 estimated . participated lining the 15-block parade route as thousands of young persons marched up Fifth-Avenue.

The participants stressed that Israel will survive despite acts of terrorism and that the Jewish peo-ple are one. The first float, whose theme was "Am Achad," carried five high school students from Maalot, Kiryat Shem-ona, Bet Shean, Shlomi and Safad, all development towns which were targets of terrorists attacks. U.S. FOR ARABS, ISRAEL, NOT PALESTINIANS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The United States will "continue its will friendship for the Arabs" and "is determined to continue its support for Israel's security," Undersec-retary of State Joseph J. Sisco told the third annual conference of the National Association of Arab Americans.

Sisco said this policy is "not inconsistent" with American inter-ests. But, he declared, that the United States will not recognize the Palestine Liberation Organization because "it is perceived in our country as a group not yet ready to pro-ceed on the basis of recognition Israel.'

Sisco, who is in charge of the Ford Administration's reassess-ment of American Middle East policy, refused to give any future hint on the

course of U.S. policy. But, he asserted, "We have got to find the way to a fresh thrust" toward a peaceful solution in the Mid-He said the east. U.S. government trying to be helpful

"special rel "special relation-ship" with Israel and said that for the past 18 months -- since the Yom Kippur War -the U.S. has been "trying to pursue a middle man's role in diplo-macy -- partially -because the Arabs and Israel wanted us" to do this. Sisco's remarks were heard in silence but he received a standing ovation when the Association's president, Richard C. Shadyac, a Washington lawyer, observed that for the first time the Number Two man at the State Department has come public with an Arab - American group."
