ISRAEL'S GLOOMY OVER VIETNAM

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Although there was no official government reaction to the fall of South Vietnam to the Viet Cong, the average Israeli saw gloomy implications for the integrity of American commitments to Israel.

Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger's reassuring words to America's friends at a White House press conference that the U.S. would stand by its commitments, had an ambiguous ring to many Israelis. Kissinger said "One lesson we must learn from this experience (Vietnam) is that we must be very careful in the commitments we make, but that we should scrupulously honor those commitments we make." The fact that Kissinger made this general reply to a specific question as to whether the failure in Vietnam meant that the U.S. will never again come to the military or economic aid of any ally, such as Israel, was seen by many Israelis as a deliberate evasion. The newspaper Maariv said in an editorial that the tragic end of American involvement in Vietnam brought about a process of reassessment of relations between the U.S. and her friends and foes alike and the U.S. must define quickly and clearly, what are the limits of its new commitments.

JEW IN THE U.S. CABINET

HENRY KISSINGER is the 6th Jew to become a member of the Presidential Cabinet. A fellow German-born Jew, OSCAR SOLOMON STRAUS, was the first! He served as Secretary of Commerce under President Theodore Roosevelt in 1906. Twenty-seven years later in 1933 President Franklin D. Roosevelt appointed Henry Morgenthau, Jr.

to be Secretary of the Treasury.

But President John F. Kennedy appointed two Jews to his cabinet: Arthur J. Goldberg as Secretary of Labor, and Abraham A. Ribicoff as Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare. Prior to Secretary of State KISSINGER, appointed by President Lyndon B. Johnson was Wilbur Cohen, also Secretary of Health, Education & Welfare.

a press conference that he did not believe the U.S. would abandon her friends in Europe, Latin America and the Middle East because of what happened in Southeast Asia. Former Defense Minister Moshe Dayan told an audience of 4000 persons in New York that the U.S. would now "think twice" before committing herself to any other country. The U.S. commitments will be "only to those countries who help themselves first," Dayan said, adding that Israel fell in this category. But in Washington, Likud leader Menachem Beigin told a National Press Club audience that the events in Vietnam support his contention that international guarantees such as Israel has been asked to accept for concessions were worthless scraps of paper.

JEW IN SWEDEN CELEBRATE 200TH

On May 4th Stockholm's 13,000 Jews celebrated their Bicentennial. It was on that date in 1775 that Swedish King Gustav III gave Aaron Isaac permission to settle in Stockholm and to hold regular Jewish services with his co-

At the Great Synagogue a Special Bicentennial service was held, and an exhibition of early Swedish Jewish life was shown in the Royal Library in Copenhagen. A special bicentenary book was also published.

BERGMAN DENIES NURSING HOME CHARGES

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Bernard Bergman has declared that charges that he operates nursing homes in an illegal and improper manner "are false, are incorrect, are untrue." He said he has been the target of a campaign of attacks by public officials and the media "of which there is no parallel since the days of Sen. Joseph McCarthy." Testifying be-

fore a one-day hearing of the Senate subcommittee on long-term care of the aged, Bergman said: "Under Oath I am proud of what I have accomplished in the nursing home industry during the 30 years I have been at it."

Bergman's testimony was preceded by witnesses who described poor conditions and treatment of patients at nursing homes including

one formerly owned by Bergman. Bergman's attorney, Nathan Lewin, charged that members of the bureaucracy in the New York State Department of Health had manufactured charges against Bergman because they did not like him and other nursing home operators who were Orthodox Jews.

Bergman denied that he had used political influence to help him get licenses for his nursing homes but said he had gone to Assemblyman Albert Blumenthal of his district and Assemblyman, now Speaker of the State Assembly, Stanley Steingut, to ask them to find out why the bureaucracy was holding out approval of his home.

Bergman said he only owned two nursing homes now and was chiefly in the business of the ownership of buildings and property on which nursing homes are located.

The subcommittee plans to question him again February 4.
