Minister Abba Eban has offered a peace plan which includes Israeli withdrawal from the bulk

of the territory occupied since June 1967.

But he said there should be a continued Israeli presence in "tactically significant" areas such as the Golan Heights and Sharm el-Sheikh and Jerusalem must remain in a unified city and the capital of Israel.

The plan, which Eban said the government should adopt without delay, also calls for a full-fledged peace treaty containing the recognition of Israel and an end to the state of war; and end to hostile action by terrorists; ironclad demilitarization arrangements; provision for the maritime rights of all parties; an end to economic warfare; and end to hostile propa-ganda; mutual compensation for Arab refugees and Jewish refugees from Arab lands and open borders. Eban said there was no contradiction between such an over-all peace plan and stepby-step negotiations.

However, Foreign Minister Yigal Allon said an overall settlement was only one of the options facing Israel. Allon ruled out Eban's suggestion that Israel map its final borders before negotiations with the Arabs

Both Eban and Allon spoke to the Labor Alignment's Knesset faction. There was no polemic even though Eban has come under bitter criticism from Premier Yitzhak Rabin and other Labor Party leaders for his public criticism of the government's policy during the recent bilateral talks with Egypt conducted by Secre-tary of State Henry A. Kissinger.

Rabin had accused Eban of being "irres-consible" and making statements which weakened Israel's position both in the U.S. and the Arab

A leading lecturer on problems of Zionist ideology proved a source of much enlightenment to representatives of the English dailies and the three TV networks during a press interview at Caesars Palace.

Jacques Torczyner, a leader in the Zionist movement for more than 30 years, knows his answers to acute questions and he responds in clear, concise, direct language. We were in clear, concise, direct language. We were proud to hear him declare without hesitation that Henry Kissinger's further meddling in affairs of the Mideast was not the key to peace. We do not agree, but it was refreshing to hear a point of view without hedging. We believe the U.S. Secretary of State, despite his recent failure, could prove most valuable in bringing

the Arabs and Jews to a negotiating table.
Torczyner, a former President of the Zionist Organization of America and currently chairman of its Administrative Board, told the assembled newsmen that both Israel and Egypt lost confidence in the U.S. because of events in the Far East. Again, we do not agree that Israel's confidence in the U.S. was affected by events in Indo China. To do so would be to equate the problems of the Far East with those of the Mid
