## BK. OF AMER., IBM REJECT ARAB PRESSURES

NEW YORK -- The Jewish American Committee welcomed the action of two of country's most prestigious tions reaffirming their determination to resist the Arab boycott and to reject any Arab pressures to discriminate against Jews or members of any other minority group.
In a statement by

its President, Elmer Winter, the AJC that Internoted that national Business Machines Corporation and the Bank of Amerihad made their position clear on this issue in recent public statements, explicitly declaring their willingness to engage in any discriminatory practices.

The IBM position was expressed by its Chairman, Board Board Frank T. Cary, at its recent annual stockholders meeting in Pittsburgh, In res-Pittsburgh. ponse to a query from a stockholder asking if the corporation had been subjected to any threats or pressures because of its business interests in Israel, Mr. Cary replied that "We do business throughout the world, in the Middle East and in Israel. We have not been black-listed in any country. We have not received any such pressures. We are not aware of any such pressures. Should we receive any, we would resist them."

The Bank of America, through its President, A. W. Clausen, like-wise reaffirmed its commitment to a nondiscriminatory policy in a letter to its offi-cers. Mr. Clausen's cers. Mr. Clausen's letter stated: "Because of wide-

spread publicity re-garding Arab boygarding Arab boy-cotts and blacklists,

this is an appropriate time to renew commitment to traditional non-discriminatory policy.

"As you know, it has long been a policy of the Bank of America to entertain questions of race, color, creed, or national origin in its business dealings. It is neither right, nor in the best interest of the bank, to participate in any credit or other business venture where a condition of the venture is

discriminatory.
"I know that I can count on all officers of the bank and its subsidiaries to that our policy in this regard is scrupulously observed,"

In his statement, Mr. Winter pointed out that "these policy state-ments by America's largest companies in the business machines field and in banking are heartening to all who are concerned about the dangers of recent Arabs attempts to spread their boycott and discrimination practices to our shores, IBM and the Bank of America, along with many other practices this country's enterprises, large and small, are demon-strating a firm ad-herence to traditional American principles. We are confident that Arab attempts to use their petro-dollars to introduce evils of religious bigotry into American business life will be rejected by the overwhelming consensus of U.S. industry."

Founded in 1906, The Jewish American Committee is country's pioneer human relations organization. It combats bigotry, protects the civil and religious rights of Jews, seeks improved human relations for all.



## FILM DOUMENTS HITLER HORROR

NEW YORK (WUP) -- The unbelievable horrors of Hitler's satanic bestiality inflicted upon Europe's Jews during World War II were resurrected in a two-hour docum-ntary film premiered at the Criterian Theatre here on April 28 -- marking the 30th anniversary of the

liberation of the concentration camps.

Entitled "The 81st Blow," and sponsored by the American Federation of Jewish Fighters, Camp Inmates, and Nazi Victims, Inc., the soulstirring Israeli produced film was later, on Saturday night, May 10, also televised for, millions

of viewers over the Public Broadcasting System.

The uniqueness of this documentary lies in the fact that the voices heard in the narration are those of men and women who had managed to escape the very horor scenes shown -- most of which filmed by the Nazi beasts themselves.

Introducing the film, former Prime Minister

Golda Meir has this to say:

"You are about to see a film produced by people of the Kubbutz of the Fighters of the Ghettos. They came from the Ghettos, the few that remained alive. You are to see the Holocaust as it happened, as it was promised by Hitler that it would happen. We must recall that Hitler let the world know well in advance exactly what he intended to do and he did his beet exactly what he intended to do, and he did his best to do it quite successfully.

"Not all the Jews were exterminated, 'only' six million. 'Only' one third of the Jewish people. But this is how it happened. People did not believe when Hitler said it would, people thought it was impossible in the 20th Century to vising semething of this bind.

to vision something of this kind ....

"There are people who do not remember any more. There are people who wish to forget. And there is an entire generation of young men and women who do not know, who were children or not yet born. For them, too, it is important that they see and realize what did happen in the 20th Century."
