## BK. OF AMER., IBM REJECT ARAB PRESSURES

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee welcomed the action of two of this country's most prestigious corporations reaffirming their determination to resist the Arab boycott and to reject any Arab pressures to discriminate against Jews or members of any other minority group.

In a statement by its President, Elmer L. Winter, the AJC noted that International Business Machines Corporation and the Bank of America had made their position clear on this issue in recent public statements, explicitly declaring their unwillingness to engage in any discriminatory practices.

The IBM position was expressed by its Board Chairman, Frank T. Cary, at its recent annual stockholders meeting in Pittsburgh. In response to a query from a stockholder asking if the corporation had been subjected to any threats or pressures because of its business interests in Israel, Mr. Cary replied that "We do business throughout the world, in the Middle East and in Israel. We have not been blacklisted in any country. We have not received any such pressures. We are not aware of any such pressures. Should we receive any, we would resist them."

The Bank of America, through its President, A. W. Clausen, likewise reaffirmed its commitment to a non-discriminatory policy in a letter to its officers. Mr. Clausen's letter stated:

"Because of widespread publicity regarding Arab boycotts and blacklists,

this is an appropriate time to renew our commitment to our traditional non-discriminatory policy.

"As you know, it has long been a policy of the Bank of America to entertain questions of race, color, creed, or national origin in its business dealings. It is neither right, nor in the best interest of the bank, to participate in any credit or other business venture where a condition of the venture is discriminatory.

"I know that I can count on all officers of the bank and its subsidiaries to see that our policy in this regard is scrupulously observed."

In his statement, Mr. Winter pointed out that "these policy statements by America's largest companies in the business machines field and in banking are heartening to all who are concerned about the dangers of recent Arabs attempts to spread their boycott and discrimination practices to our shores. IBM and the Bank of America, along with many other of this country's enterprises, large and small, are demonstrating a firm adherence to traditional American principles. We are confident that Arab attempts to use their petro-dollars to introduce the evils of religious bigotry into American business life will be rejected by the overwhelming consensus of U.S. industry."

Founded in 1906, The American Jewish Committee is this country's pioneer human relations organization. It combats bigotry, protects the civil and religious rights of Jews, seeks improved human relations for all.

## FILM DOCUMENTS HITLER HORROR

NEW YORK (WUP) -- The unbelievable horrors of Hitler's satanic bestiality inflicted upon Europe's Jews during World War II were resurrected in a two-hour documentary film premiered at the Criterion Theatre here on April 28 -- marking the 30th anniversary of the liberation of the concentration camps.

Entitled "The 81st Blow," and sponsored by the American Federation of Jewish Fighters, Camp Inmates, and Nazi Victims, Inc., the soul-stirring Israeli produced film was later, on Saturday night, May 10, also televised for millions of viewers over the Public Broadcasting System.

The uniqueness of this documentary lies in the fact that the voices heard in the narration are those of men and women who had managed to escape the very horror scenes shown -- most of which filmed by the Nazi beasts themselves.

Introducing the film, former Prime Minister Golda Meir has this to say:

"You are about to see a film produced by people of the Kibbutz of the Fighters of the Ghettos. They came from the Ghettos, the few that remained alive. You are to see the Holocaust as it happened, as it was promised by Hitler that it would happen. We must recall that Hitler let the world know well in advance exactly what he intended to do, and he did his best to do it quite successfully.

"Not all the Jews were exterminated, 'only' six million. 'Only' one third of the Jewish people. But this is how it happened. People did not believe when Hitler said it would, people thought it was impossible in the 20th Century to vision something of this kind....

"There are people who do not remember any more. There are people who wish to forget. And there is an entire generation of young men and women who do not know, who were children or not yet born. For them, too, it is important that they see and realize what did happen in the 20th Century."
